



NAFCAree 2020 Rideau Acres Campground 1014 Cunningham Road Kingston, Ontario K7L 4V3 Canada

Your NAFCAree Committee continues to put together a full week of camping fun with your friends and chapter mates. Full plans are nearly complete and I can assure you, you will not want to miss out on one of the camping highlights of this year!

Campsites continue to be booked. As the time passes, more and more of the sites are being booked and you would not want to be left out. Rideau Acres Campground is very large with many campsites, although NAFCA has only 74 to offer out to our members who go to the NAFCAree 2020.

The committee has a full week planned (see other articles for trip details) of activities and you may be as busy you would like to be. The area near Rideau Acres is steeped in history this being the former Capital of Canada (Ottawa is now the Canadian capital). Kingston was founded in 1673. Kingston is located on Lake Ontario at the junction of Cataraqui and St. Lawrence Rivers. This is a vast unspoiled water playground with access to the Thousand Islands. Are you an ice hockey buff? The International Hockey Hall Of Fame is here and well worth a look see. Donations are accepted (no entry fee). Kingston has lots of shopping and restaurants for your pleasure. There is a farmers market which operates on Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday, 6am to

6pm, behind city hall in market square.

The Loyalist Parkway (Hwy 33), is a 60 mile drive from Kingston to Trenton, passing through 14 towns along the shoreline of Lake Ontario. There are areas along the parkway offering opportunities for bicycling, swimming, fishing, boating and picnicking. Also 40 archaeological sites and 125 historical buildings are adjacent to the highway for sightseeing. Lake Ontario Park on King Street has swimming & picnic areas. Excellent fishing, golfing, scuba diving & facilities for most fresh water sports, ferries depart from Ontario Street, linking Kingston with Wolfe Island and Cape Vincent, NY.

There are so many recreational opportunities in the Kingston general area for all fit levels and ages, I'm sure you will find many things and events you and your family may partake of. Also, Rideau Acres has many recreational things to do as well if you want to stay within the campground such as a swimming pool, game room, walking trails, river swimming, many kinds of boats to rent and lots of other things to do. I do believe you can fish from the campground Shore (a license to fish may be required check with the campground first).

You'll need to make a \$100 deposit, payable to NAFCA to hold a campsite and all money for campsites, trips, meals and clothing is due in full June 1 and mailed to: Carol Robison, 18 Amy Ave, Leominster, MA 01453. If you do it now you'll be "On The Go In Ontario".

Your NAFCAree Committee is looking forward to hosting you at Rideau Acres Campground. All our hard work will be to give you, NAFCA Families, the best time in Ontario, Canada. Come and enjoy the fruits of our labor on your behalf.

NAFCAree Trips

TROLLEY TOUR - Sunday – Trolley Tour – We have commandeered our own Kingston Trolley Tour. Explore the history of Canada's first capital aboard our own thirty-two passenger trolley. The trolley will pick up right at the campground and take us to Fort Henry and the Penitentiary Museum, along the way we will hear about the history of Kingston as we make our way from one location to the other. Included in

this trip are a guided tour of Fort Henry and a guided tour of the Penitentiary. Explore what Kingston has to offer! (There is a possibility that the Penitentiary will not open this summer – If that is the case we have other stops planned along this historic route)

OTTAWA - Monday - Ottawa "Changing of the Guards" - Please join us for a very full day of activities in the beautiful city of Ottawa. We plan to leave the campground early in a coach bus to travel to Ottawa in time to see the changing of the guards at 10:00 am. There are sooo many things to do in the area of the capital building including restaurants and shops. Our plan is to arrive at Ottawa by 9:00 to see the changing of the guards at 10:00 – this lasts 30 minutes. After that, you will have options. We will plan a walking tour of the area which ends at the restaurant area. A brief lunch stops before heading to a tour of congress then down to the river for a boat ride on the Ottawa River before heading back to the campground. If you would like, you can choose to get go off on your own and meet us later at the boat to see what you would like to see. There are free museums and activities in Ottawa. This tour does have a 30 person minimum for the cost of the bus, so please reserve early. If we do not have 30 people, we make other transportation arrangements.

MUSIC MAN - Thursday - Thursday we are planning a trip to Gananoque which is a city slightly north east of Kingston along the St. Lawrence Seaway. We are offering several options for that day, #1 We will be going to a matinee "Music Man" at the Thousand Islands Playhouse - Canada's Dockside Theatre, a waterfront performing arts venue. Again, please reserve early as this will sell out. #2 Join us for the bus ride and enjoy the afternoon at the Thousand Islands Shorelines Casino where you can enjoy slots and games as well as a buffet. The bus will pick you up for the return trip home. #3.Join us for the bus ride and enjoy the afternoon in Gananoque on your own, (There are many things to do including taking in a boat ride on the Thousand Islands Seaway, which leaves every half hour, or have lunch at the Gananoque Brewing Company.) Just meet us back at the bus at the theater for the bus ride home.

UPPER CANADA VILLAGE – Fri-

day – On Friday we will be going to the Upper Canada Village, a heritage park near Morrisburg Ontario which depicts a 19th century village as it was in Canada. Learn the history and heritage of the first settlers of the area. There are many activities and interesting homesteads to explore, learn to milk the cows and walk a calf, you can visit the bakery and flour mill while you tour the village and learn about life in the 1860's. We will return at a reasonable time to allow for rest and relaxation before your trip home.

NAFCAREE 2020 Kingston Ghost Tour

NAFCAREE 2020 "On The go in Ontario"! The Haunted Walk Experience Ghost Tour will be offered. To all the brave and adventuresome campers, curious about ghostly and gruesome historical events, the walking tour reveals Kingston's historically chilling moments through the art of storytelling. A costumed guide will lead us to the spookiest spots by lantern light and reveal tales of restless souls, tragic murders and grave robbing.

Upper Canada Village Tour

Ever wonder how the people of Kingston lived in the 1860's? Well you're in luck with our tour to the Upper Canada Village. The village was founded in 1961 and serves to depict life in a rural English Canadian setting during the year 1866. The site includes over 40 historical buildings including some that are still in operation today, including a cheese factory. Back in the

1860's, cheese was an important revenue source in the local economy. They make the cheese the same way and with the same equipment that they did in the 1860s. Staff dressed in the clothing of this time period discuss aspects of the daily life including social life, music, religion, and politics.

While at the village, you can learn about the Battle of Crysler's Farm, a battle of the War of 1812, which is memorialized at the park. If you want to learn more about the battle, the village offers a miniature train ride with realistic and sudden cannon fire during the journey. If you're looking for a leisurely stroll through the village, you can take a horse drawn wagon ride departing from Cook's Tavern for a 20 minute loop along village streets.

The area offers several dining experiences, including Willards Hotel, which serves historical cuisine from costumed staff. The hotel does serve beer and wine as well. If you want to satisfy your sweet tooth, they serve BeaverTails. These pastries are hand stretched to resemble the tail of a beaver and are served piping hot with your choice of toppings.

For those with kids, the Village offers a family activity center for all kinds of 1860's-style fun. Here kids can learn about historic props, clothing, games and activities, and many of the tools seen during the visit to the village. One of their favorite activities is learning how to write with a quill pen. Little ones can also put on a puppet show.

To remember your trip, you can also dress up in the historical costumes of the time at the Photography Studio, and be taken in an authentic 1860's photograph. In addition to that, the village also offers Canadian crafts such as tinware, yarn and blankets. They also sell historical books, teas, spices, jams and marinades. You can also purchase village bread baked fresh daily, and cheese made from the factory. We hope you will join us for this adventure back in time.

Chicken Pasta Casserole

1 cup chopped onion

1 cup chopped celery

½ cup each chopped green and yellow pepper

3 tbsp olive oil

1 lb boneless skinless chicken breasts, cubed

2 tsp garlic powder

1 jar (16 oz) salsa

1 tbsp cornstarch

1 tbsp water

1 tbsp dried parsley

½ tsp salt

1/4 tsp hot pepper sauce

hot cooked pasta

In a large saucepan over mediumhigh heat, sauté onion, celery and pepper for 3-4 minutes or until crisp-tender. Add chicken and garlic powder; cook for 4-5 minutes or until chicken juices run clear. Stir in salsa. Combine cornstarch and water; stir into the chicken mixture. Bring to a boil; cook and stir for 2 minutes or until mixture is thickened and bubbly. Add the parsley, salt and hot pepper sauce; mix well. Serve over pasta. 4 servings.

Blueberry Yogurt Muffins

1 cup flour
6 tbsp sugar
1/4 tsp salt
1/4 tsp baking powder
1/4 tsp baking soda
1 egg
1/2 cup vanilla yogurt
3 tbsp canola oil
2 tbsp 2% milk

½ cup frozen blueberries

In a small bowl, combine the flour, sugar, salt, baking powder and baking soda. In another bowl, combine the egg, yogurt, oil and milk. Stir into dry ingredients just until moistened. Fold in berries. Fill greased or paper lined muffin cups ¾ full. Bake at 350°

for 20-22 minutes or until a toothpick comes out clean. Cool for 5 minutes before removing from pan to a wire rack. 6 muffins.

Kielbasa & Pepper Casserole

½ lb smoked kielbasa or polish sausage, cut into 1/2 inch slices

4 small red potatoes, halved

1 medium onion, halved and sliced

1 medium sweet red pepper, cut into 1 inch pieces

2 tbs olive oil

1/8 tsp salt

1/8 tsp pepper

1/4 cup heavy whipping cream

In a small bowl, combine the sausage, potatoes, onion and red pepper. Drizzle with oil; sprinkle with salt and pepper. Toss to coat. Transfer to a greased 1 quart baking dish.

Cover and bake at 375° for 45 minutes. Stir in cream; cover and bake 10-15 minutes longer or until vegetables are tender and cream has thickened. 2 servings.

Slow Cooker Beef Brisket

1 large onion, sliced

1 fresh beef brisket (3-4 lbs)

1/4 tsp pepper

1 (4 ½ oz) sliced mushrooms, drained

3/4 cup beef broth

½ cup chili sauce

1/4 cup packed brown sugar

2 garlic cloves, minced

1/4 cup flour

1/4 cup cold water

Place onion in a 5 qt slow cooker, Rub brisket with pepper, place over onion. Top with mushrooms. In a small bowl, combine the broth, chili sauce, brown sugar and garlic; pour over brisket. Cover and cook on low for 8-9 hours or until meat is tender.

Remove brisket and keep warm. In a small bowl, combine flour and water until smooth; stir into cooking juices. Cover and cook on high for 30 minutes or until thickened. Slice brisket; serve with gravy.

Turkey Chili

1/4 cup EVOO

1 bell pepper, finely chopped

1 onion, finely chopped

1/4 cup tomato paste

1 tbsp chili powder

3/4 lb ground turkey

Salt and pepper

1 (14 ½ oz can) fire-roasted crushed tomatoes

1 (12 oz) bottle beer

1 (15 ½ oz) can kidney beans rinsed

Set aside 2 tbsp chopped bell pepper and add the remaining bell pepper and the onion to the Dutch oven; cook, stirring, until softened, about 5 minutes. Stir in the tomato paste and chili powder. Add the turkey, season with salt and cook, breaking it up and stirring to combine, 3-4 minutes.

Pour in the crushed tomatoes and beer, bring to boil, then lower the heat and simmer, stirring occasionally, for 10 minutes. Add the kidney beans and cook until heated through, about 5 minutes more. Season with salt and pepper.

Peanut Butter Banana Cake

½ cup butter, softened

1 1/2 cups sugar

2 eggs

1 cup mashed ripe bananas 2-3 medium

1 tsp vanilla

2 cups flour

2 tsp baking powder

1 tsp baking soda

½ cup milk

Frosting:

1/3 cup creamy peanut butter

1/3 cup milk

1 1/2 tsp vanilla

3 cups confectioners' sugar

In a large mixing bowl, cream butter and sugar. Add eggs, one at a time, beating well after each addition. Add banana and vanilla; mix well. Combine flour, baking powder and baking soda; add to creamed mixture alternately with milk.

Transfer to a greased 13 x 9 baking pan. Bake at 350° for 30-35 minutes or until a toothpick inserted near the center comes out clean. Cool on wire rack.

For frosting, in a mixing bowl, beat the peanut butter, milk and vanilla until blended; beat in confectioners' sugar until smooth. Spread over cake. 12 servings.
