Camping Reservations

The cost for a full hook up site (water, electric, sewer and cable TV) for the week will be \$575.00. Extra Family in a rig will be \$100 and extra adults will be \$50 each.

Cabins: There are several types of cabins available that range in price from \$ 778.60 to \$1,593.42 for the week. You will need to make your own reservations for a cabin by calling Kelsey Nelson at 844-289-6234. Some of these cabins will be near the rest of the group and some will not be.

For reference, the cabins nearest our group are on Picket's Thicket road. Please mention that you are with NAFCA when making the reservation to receive the discount. If you will be renting a cabin, you will still need to fill out a reservation form and pay the \$50 Admin fee to cover NAFCAree costs (the same that everyone else is paying in their camping fee).

What's Cooking?

Red Devil's Food Cake

1 1/2 C. Flour 1 tsp. Baking Powder 2 eggs, well beaten 1/2 C. Sour Milk 1/2 C. Hot Water 1 C. Sugar 1 tsp. Baking Soda 2 Sq. Chocolate 1/2 tsp. Salt 1 tsp. Vanilla

Cream butter and sugar; add beaten eggs, flour and sour milk. Cut chocolate into hot water; stir until melted. Add soda and salt. Let cool slightly before adding to cake mixture. Lastly add vanilla. In an 8 or 9 inch pan bake at 350 degrees until done and toothpick inserted center comes out clean. Approximately 25-35 minutes.
