ARE YOU READY TO BEET THE DRUM?

The committee has worked hard over the last year under difficult conditions to bring you the best NAFCaree possible. They have given up their time and additional expense with little benefit to make sure you enjoy your time in Gettysburg. We hope you will recognize their efforts during the week and remember that they are volunteers and are on vacation too!

PAYMENT REMINDERS: By now, you should be full paid up for camping and your trips. If not, please remit your final payment so we can meet our obligations to pay the bills!

CANCELLATIONS: If you cannot attend the NAFCaree or one or more of the trips you signed up for PLEASE let us know as soon as possible. **You may cancel the camping portion of the reservation up to 60 days prior to your arrival with forfeiture of a one nights deposit. Because we have already purchased most of the tickets for the trip venues, refunds on trips are contingent upon finding someone else to purchase your tickets or the venue allowing us to reduce our reservation.** If either of these cases apply, your refund will be mailed to you after the conclusion of the NAFCaree.

Trips: At this point most of the trips are set. However, we may have some openings. If you are interested in any of the trips, please contact Bill Neeb and he will let you know what is available.

NAFCA Membership Reminder: All attendees must be NAFCA members, no exceptions. You cannot bring guests or your children's friends to the NAFCaree unless they or their parents are Members. We apologize, but this is a NAFCA requirement.

Extra Adults / children: If you are bringing any extra adults / children not listed on your original reservation, please let us know as soon as you know so we can include them in the prize drawings and we know that they are coming.

Directions: We suggest you take whatever route you are comfortable with to get to Interstate 81 south in PA and follow it south to Harrisburg.

Where 581 splits off to the left in Harrisburg, (the sign will say Gettysburg) take that left. Follow that road and it will take you to highway 15 south. Get off at the Hanover Road Exit. Take a left and go under the under pass, take the SECOND left after going under the underpass as the first left takes you back onto highway 15. If you need step by step directions, you can type **1 Rocky Grove Road Gettysburg PA 17320** into google maps and it will pull the Drummer Boy Campground up!

Check-in: All Members with RV site reservations will be provided with a NAFCaree placard to make Check-in easier. The Committee will have someone at the entrance looking for the placard. Upon arrival, place the placard in your window or waive it at the committee member and you will be directed to your site without needing to go in the office to Check-in.

Early Arrivals: If you are arriving prior to Saturday and have an RV site, please call Irene Phelps, 774-262-7528 or Mike DiMauro 413 531-8520 about 15 minutes prior to arrival and we will meet you at the entrance.

Cabins: If you have rented a cabin, you must check-in at the office. We will catch up with you with your goodie bag and information packet by opening ceremonies.

Check-In/Check-Out: Check-in time after 3:00PM. RV site Check-out time is 1:00PM. Cabin and Cottages have a check-out time of 11:00AM

Campground Amenities: Drummer Boy Camping Resort has a lot of amenities. They include; Spa & Swimming Pool, 250' Waterslide with Activity Pool, Deli on the Deck" Snack Bar, Two Laundry Facilities, Impeccably Clean, Modern Restrooms, Game Room & Recreation Hall, Mini Golf, Playgrounds, Auto Tour CD Rentals, Gettysburg & DC Bus Tours, Fishing pond (no license required!), Volleyball and Basketball Courts, Outdoor Movie Theater and a Store & Gift Shop.

Pet Policies (Assistance Animals Excluded) - Please note that due to Health Department

regulations, pets are only permitted in designated "Pet Friendly" Cabins and Cottages. If you are found with your pet in a building, a \$150.00 clean up fee may be applied and you may be asked to leave the campground without a refund. All pets must be kept on a leash (no longer than 6') and under the control of the pet owner at all times. Please clean up after your pet immediately. Please do not tie up pets at site and leave them unattended. Owners are responsible for the actions of their pets and the pets of their guests. Pets annoying other guests or is deemed a nuisance will be asked to leave the campground. Drummer Boy RV, LLC and its affiliates shall be held harmless and assume no liability, implied or otherwise, for animal bites or injury. Attack prone dog breeds and exotic pets are not permitted at Drummer Boy. Please ask prior to arrival. Limit of two pets per site.

Firewood: Firewood transported across state lines is prohibited in Pennsylvania. Please purchase firewood from the campground or local merchant. Most sites have a fire ring. Please follow the Campground rules for fires.

Leveling Blocks. Please bring ample leveling blocks as not all sites are level.

Donations of Door / raffle prizes – if you have a new item you are willing to donate, or if you know a business owner that is willing to donate items for door or raffle prizes please bring them with you to the NAFCaree.

Thursday arrival available for those who wish for a longer weekend. Let's do a "wind down the week" on Friday night. Bring a treat to share by the fire. Any leftover treats from Friday will be available Saturday by the fire. If possible, individually wrap your goodies to be safe.

We will again enjoy a spaghetti dinner on Saturday 5:30 PM -6:30 PM put on by the campground – their fundraiser for the Shriners. Dinner includes meatballs, salad, roll and dessert. Bring your own set up. Let us know if you want to attend and we will order the tickets. We will advise the cost. We will collect payment on Friday.

Directions: They are located at 152 River St in Bernardston, Massachusetts

****CAUTION**:** If using GPS, make sure you enter "River STREET" as there is a River ROAD within the same postal area code. The River Road address will send you to a dirt road in a neighboring town where you will have to turn around in a farmer's field. From I-91 take New Exit 50A/B (old exit 28A/B northbound or southbound). Take a right off the Exit onto Route 10. Follow Route 10 to the STOP sign. Take a left on Routes 5 and 10, left on Cross Street, right at fork in road, right on River Street. Campground is on the left. From Route 2 (Mohawk Trail) westbound, take the second right past the Gill traffic light (Adams Road), follow for approximately 4 miles, campground is on the right.
