Keeping in mind that there is much controversy among historians because most of the legends are oral lore signaling the escape of the slaves via the “under ground railroad” The “Jacob’s Ladder” pattern of our raffle quilt is a pattern often used with secret encoded messages hung outside that signaled the slaves they had reached a safe haven.

The quilt is made with reproduction period fabric. It measures 54” x 77 1/2”. The raffle tickets are \$2.00 each or 3/\$5.00.

Camping Reservations: The cost for a full hook up site (water, electric, sewer and cable TV) for the week will be \$575.00. Extra Family in a rig will be \$100 and extra adults will be \$50 each. **A \$100 minimum deposit was due April 1st. Final payment is due by May 1, 2021.** After that, the remaining sites will be turned back to the campground.

Cabins: There are several types of cabins available that range in price from \$ 778.60 to \$1,593.42 for the week. You will need to make your own reservations for a cabin by calling Kelsey Nelson at 844-289-6234. Some of these cabins will be near the rest of the group and some will not be. **For reference, the cabins nearest our group are on Picket's Thicket road.** Please mention that you are with NAFCFA when making the reservation to receive the discount. If you will be renting a cabin, you will still need to fill out a reservation form and pay the \$50 Admin fee to cover NAFCAreae costs (the same that everyone else is paying in their camping fee). Annual Membership Report

We started April 2020 with 605 members and ended with 587 on March 31, 2021.

There were 80 memberships that did not renew, a third of them being one-time memberships, which has been the trend the past few years.

There were 47 new memberships and 15 re-instated.

As for new members, 32 of the 47 were from Maine, 7 for Chapter 8, 5 non-chapter and 3 signing up to attend the NAFCAreae. The majority, 36 responses, mention family or friend as to how they found NAFCFA. This shows us that most new members are joining because of a friend or family member.

From I-91 take New Exit 50A/B (old exit 28A/B northbound or southbound). Take a right off the Exit onto Route 10. Follow Route 10 to the STOP sign. Take a left on Routes 5 and 10, left on Cross Street, right at fork in road, right on River Street. Campground is on the left. From Route 2 (Mohawk Trail) westbound, take the second right past the Gill traffic light (Adams Road), follow for approximately 4 miles, campground is on the right.
