Migneault, May 14th – 16th, 2021 Spencer County Fairgrounds. Possible theme: Let's Have Fun in 2021. Looking to have same committee as 2020.

Web Site – Bill Neeb reported that Ben French moved the email address for the Campfire Chatter to CampfireChatter@NAFCA.org.

Sustaining Members - The sustaining members haven't changed since the last report. We are still at 27. All current members are up to date with dues.

The Quahaug Chapter was recently camping at Sandy Pond Campground in Plymouth. Keith LeBlanc spoke with the manager about becoming a sustaining member, so I sent them a letter and application. Over the winter months, look over the list and try to schedule a campout somewhere you haven't been and let's hope the virus won't have the same impact on our camping plans as it did this year.

Membership – Our current membership is at 576. Since January we have 52 new memberships and 92 not renewing. From that, 27 had been one-time members. In 2019, 60 new members but lost 100 and 46 had been new. Going back to 2018, 80 new members and lost 67, 21 were one-time members. So, we are getting new members, problem is not retaining them. Over the last 3 years, we are losing about a third of members that had one-time memberships. A suggestion was made to send emails to members not renewing asking why they dropped membership.

Discussion ensued about NAFCA's insurance coverage as related to the Maine Chapters, and the risks therein. Additional discussion also ensued as to NAFCA's insurance coverage and costs. By changing insurance carriers earlier this year, NAFCA's premium was reduced by over \$800.

President Linda Ostiguy led a discussion of creating a new Chapter in Maine and in Maryland.

Sports Rules – No changes

Auxiliary – Linda Ostiguy and Karen Donnelly have committed to taking possession of the NAFCA Auxiliary items from Dale Bradley. They plan to inventory the items and sell off what they can.

Conservation - October weekend at Otter River State Park cancelled. Plans are being made to hold the weekend in April 2021.

Scholarship Committee – President Linda Ostiguy read the Scholarship Report for the three months ended September 30, 2020.

NAFCA Cares - Doris Lewis had a new great grandson.

Correspondence - President Ostiguy read two letters received from Don and Virginia Daniel. One refers to improving NAFCA's financial position.

The second letter promotes a user fee for events

covered by NAFCA's general liability insurance policy to be used to offset the cost of the insurance.

A discussion ensued as to how this recommendation may or may not work at different NAFCA events. Some events, such as the NAFCA booth at the Springfield Camping and RV show, provides insurance for any damages caused by negligence at NAFCA's booth. PV8, who runs the event, is not covered by the NAFCA policy, and therefore has no basis to provide NAFCA with funding for the policy. Also asking Spring Safari to pay NAFCA a portion of its profits, is asking NAFCA to pay NAFCA. The recommendation may hold merit when a Chapter such as the Quahaugs run a public event as Camp-O-Rama or the state Fall Frolic.

The NAFCAree 2020 Committee was discharged by President Linda Ostiguy.

New Business - President Linda Ostiguy raised the topic of potentially changing the voting procedures for NAFCArees and Spring Safari's from a Chapter delegate vote to a format of membership voting. Discussion ensued as to whether members would need to be present at the Council of Chapters meeting to vote, or if it should be a general membership voting procedure.

NAFCA Treasury Audit – An audit of the NAFCA Fiscal Year End financial records was performed by Michael DiMauro Sr. Mike found the treasury records to be in good order.

Cancellation of Annual Meeting - Due to Covid restrictions it is difficult if not impossible to hold, at this time of year, an indoor meeting. Therefore, the decision has been made to cancel this meeting.

Campfire Chatter Editor Position – Dick Basha, has presented his last edition. No successor has been named. The officers request that members poll their chapters for a candidate for the position.

NAFCA Membership Dues Increase - The Board has decided on a dues increase which will go into effect as of January 1, 2021. The dues structure will be 1 yr./\$30, 2 yr./\$55, 3 yr./\$75.

A question about converting all members to a January renewal date was raised and discussion ensued as to its feasibility. There is also concern about chapters

collecting dues on behalf of NAFCA, as this practice has led to lost membership funds and records.

Proposals Request for Spring Safari 2022 and NAFCAree 2022 – Deadline for proposals for these events will be February 28,2021.

Campfire Chatter Subscription Cost - President Linda Ostiguy reported on a member's suggestion to charge a fee for the printed Chatter. A discussion ensued as to the pros and cons of doing so. However, it is stated that in the Campfire Chatter and on membership cards that the Chatter is included in the dues. It was decided that this recommendation required further study.

STUFFED CABBAGE SOUP

4 tbsp extra virgin olive oil 1 cup raw white rice 1 quart + 2 cups chicken stock, divided 1 ½ lbs ground meatloaf mix (pork, veal and beef) $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp allspice $1\frac{1}{2}$ tsp coriander 2 tsp smoked paprika Salt Pepper 1 bay leaf 1 onion, chopped 2 cloves garlic, minced 1 carrot thinly sliced with a vegetable peeler into strips then finely chopped. $\frac{1}{2}$ to $\frac{3}{4}$ head savoy cabbage, slice thin 1 (28 oz) can diced tomatoes 1 cup tomato sauce Handful of flat leaf parsley, chopped 3 tbsp dill, finely chopped

Heat a sauce pot over medium high heat with 2 turns of the pan of extra virgin olive oil, about 2 tbsps. Add the rice and toss to coat in oil. Add 2 cups of chicken stock, bring to a simmer, cover and cook for 16-18 minutes or until the rice is tender.

Heat a deep pot over medium high heat. Add the remaining olive oil, once hot add meat and begin to brown, 2 - 3 minutes. Season the meat with all spice, coriander, smoked paprika, salt and pepper. Add bay leaf, onions, garlic and carrots. Cook veggies 2-3 minutes to begin to soften them, then add cabbage and wilt it down a bit. Add tomatoes, tomato sauce, and remaining stock and cover the pot. Raise heat to high and bring to a simmer. Simmer for about 10 minutes. Once the rice is cooked, add to the soup and continue to simmer for 2-3 minutes. Stir in parsley and dill, adjust the salt and pepper to your taste and serve.

SPICED PUMPKIN CHEESECAKE

38 ginger snaps, finely crushed ¹/₄ cup finely chopped pecans ¹/₄ cup butter melted 4 pkg (8 0z each) cream cheese, softened 1 cup sugar 1 (15 oz) can pumpkin 1 tbsp pumpkin pie spice 1 tsp vanilla 4 eggs 1 cup thawed cool whip topping

 $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp ground nutmeg

Heat oven to 325°. Mix crumbs, nuts and butter; press onto bottom and 1 inch up side of 9 inch springform pan. Beat cream cheese and sugar with mixer until blended. Add pumpkin, spice and vanilla; mix well. Add eggs, 1 at a time, mixing after each, just until blended. Pour into crust. Bake 1 hour 20 minutes to 1 hour 30 minutes or until center is almost set. Loosen cake from rim of pan; cool before removing rim. Refrigerate 4 hours. Serve with a dollop of Cool Whip and a dusting of nutmeg.
