NAFCAree 2019

NAFCAree is only a few weeks away. Let's hope for some fine summer weather.

As you prepare for the trip keep in mind that there are shopping options near the campground. While our section of the campground will seem quiet and away from it all, we will be close to the main road and route 1.

In addition to fine dining and seafood establishments, you will also find your favorite fast food, chain restaurants, and pizza shops nearby. Amongst all these, you will find Hannafords supermarket at the corner of Route 5 and Route 1, just over one mile from the campground. There is also a Market Basket and a Walmart Superstore 15 minutes down the road in Biddeford. If you come with transportation, you will be able to purchase many of your supplies locally.

NAFCAree Arrival. When you arrive at the Campground you will guided directly to the entrance gate without having to stop at the office. There are three lanes in the campground entrance. A NAFCAree committee member will be stationed at the entrance to guide you into the left lane which will be your express lane into the campground. Before you come, we will send you a

NAFCAree pass that you will present to the security guard for admittance.

Once through the gate you will take an immediate right following the main road that will take you to Black Forest. The committee will greet you here with your welcome package, and will then show you to your site, and help you park.

The sites are all level. At most you may want a piece of plywood for that final tweak. Hook up your water, electric, sewer, cable, find the WiFi, pull out the beach chairs, and you're good to go!

To get to Old Orchard Beach Campground take the Maine Turnpike to Exit 36,

I-195. As I-195 merges with Route 5 at exit 1, the campground will be on your immediate right. Alternate detailed directions were in the May Chatter.

Directions:

They are located at 152 River St in Bernardston, Massachusetts, off I-91 Exit 28B northbound, or Exit 28 southbound. Take a right off the Exit onto Route 10. Take your first left onto River Street. The campground is approximately one half mile on the left.

***For RV's over 11' in height follow Route 10 to the STOP sign. Take a left on Routes 5 and 10, left on Cross Street, right at fork in road, right on River Street. Campground is on the left.

From Route 2 (Mohawk Trail) westbound, take the second right past the Gill traffic light (Adams Road), follow for approximately 4 miles, campground is on the right.

**CAUTION If using GPS, make sure you enter "River STREET' as there is a River ROAD within the same postal area code. The River Road address will send you to a dirt road in a neighboring town where you will have to turn around in a farmer's field.

Enjoy! What's Cooking

ROSY BEEF NOODLE TWOSOME

1 can condensed beef noodle soup

1 1/2 cans water

1 can condensed tomato soup or

1 can condensed tomato rice soup

Blend soups and water in saucepan. Heat, stirring occasionally. Makes 4 servings.

SWEDISH MEATBALLS

1 can condensed cream of celery soup

1 lb ground beef

1 egg, slightly beaten

1 tbsp chopped parsley

1 tbsp shortening

1 tosp shortering

½ soup can water

2/3 cup fine dry bread crumbs

2 tbsp mince onion

1 tsp salt

1 – 2 tbs minced dill pickle (if desired)

Blend soup and water, measure out ¼ cup of this mixture; combine with beef, bread crumbs, egg, onion, parsley and salt. Shape into balls about 1 inch in diameter, In large skillet, brown meatballs in shortening. Add remaining soup and dill pickle. Cook covered over low heat about 20 minutes. Stir now and then. Makes 4 servings

Tuna Chowder

1 envelope (2 3/8) cream of potato dry soup mix

2 cups water

1 can (7 oz) tuna, drained and flaked

1 cup cooked mixed vegetables

1 tb lemon juice

Empty soup into saucepan, gradually stir in water, mix until

smooth. Bring to a boil, stirring. Partially cover, simmer 10 minutes. Stirring now and then. Add remaining ingredients; heat. Makes 3-4 servings.

SOUPER SCRAMBLED EGGS

1 can condensed cheddar cheese, cream of mushroom or celery soup 8 eggs, slightly beaten

Dash pepper

2 tbsp butter or margarine

Stir soup until smooth; blend in eggs and pepper. In skillet, melt butter, pour in egg mixture. Cook over low heat until set. Lifting eggs gently now and then. Makes 4-6 servings.

PEANUT CRUNCHES

3 cups crisp sugar coated corn cereal 2 squares unsweetened chocolate ½ cup chunk style peanut butter 1/3 cup butter or margarine 32 marshmallows

Combine butter, peanut butter, marshmallow and chocolagte in pan. Cook over low heat and stir until ingredients are melted and well blended. Remove from fire, add cereal and mix. Pat into buttered 8" square pan and let stand until cool. Then cut into bars.

BLUEBERRY SQUARES

Make these to take with you

3 cups flour

2 sticks margarine

1 1/2 cups sugar

2 eggs

2 tsp baking powder

1 tsp vanilla

Mix well together with pastry blender or 2 knives until crumble. Don't'let margarine get too soft or mixture will not spread. Use ½ of the mixture for bottom. Press ino 9" x 13" pan. Spread 1 can of blueberry pie filling over crumbs. Sprinkle remaining crumbs on top. Pat down slightly. Other fillings may be used. Bake 375° for 30-35 minutes.
