***For RV's over 11' in height follow Route 10 to the STOP sign. Take a left on Routes 5 and 10, left on Cross Street, right at fork in road, right on River Street. Campground is on the left.

From Route 2 (Mohawk Trail) westbound, take the second right past the Gill traffic light (Adams Road), follow for approximately 4 miles, campground is on the right.

**CAUTION If using GPS, make sure you enter "River STREET' as there is a River ROAD within the same postal area code. The River Road address will send you to a dirt road in a neighboring town where you will have to turn around in a farmer's field.



3rd Annual Porsches In The Park – Portland ME

If you are not going shopping in Freeport on Sunday and you are looking for something to do you may want to consider going to Portland for the 3rd Annual Porches in the Park Car Show. The fundraiser is scheduled to be held on Bud Light State Park from 11:00 am to 2 pm as Porsches gather along the magnificent rocky coast of Maine in an all Porsche car show to benefit the Dempsey Center. The Dempsey Center provides free support services to anyone impacted by cancer. Last year 214 Porsches participated and this year we are expecting more than 250 cars.

There will be Porsches from all over the northeast with models ranging from the classic 1960's model 356, to the latest Porsche 911's, Panamera's, and SUV's. Air-cooled, water-cooled, rear-engine, front-engine and mid-engine. This will be the largest gathering of Porsches in Maine since 1986.

Money raised will go to the Dempsey Center. Food will be available for purchase from various food trucks and there will be opportunities to buy Porsche memorabilia as well as to talk cars with the people who own them and love them.

This event is open for viewing by the public with a requested donation of \$5 per attendee. Children are welcome and those under 12 are free.

These recipes are very special! They are submitted by Pat Hatch from No. Weymouth. A cover letter states that she suspects they came from the Connecticut State Group. And that these recipes date from the early days of NAFCA. Enjoy! What's Cookin?

Hamburg Stew In Casserole

- 2 lb potatoes pared and quartered (canned)
- 1 ½ lb small white onions (canned)
- 1 bunch small carrots-frozen or canned 1 package thawed frozen or canned peas
- 2 lb ground chuck
- 1 egg
- 1 cup day-old bread crumbs
- 2 ½ tsp salt
- 3/4 tsp Worcestershire sauce
- 2/3 cup milk
- 1/3 cup salad oil
- 1 ½ lb small fresh mushrooms (canned)
- 1 can mushroom gravy
- 3/4 tsp onion salt (or MSG)

Mix meat, egg, crumbs, salt, Worcestershire and milk. Drop by teaspoonful or make into small balls and brown on all sides in hot oil in skillet. Remove, in same skillet sauté mushrooms until tender; remove, then n skillet, heat soup with nutmeg, gravy and onion salt. Arrange vegetables and meat in Dutch oven or rather deep kettle. Pour in sauce. Mash and season potatoes; arrange in mounds around edge. (at camp use instant potatoes) Cook for about ½ hour, slowly.

Southern Spread

- 2 lb ground beef
- 1 cup chopped onion
- 2 cans chicken gumbo soup
- 4 Tbsp catsup
- 2 Tbsp prepared mustard
- 1 tsp salt
- 1 cup Green pepper, chopped
- 1/2 cup celery, chopped

Brown meat in fat. Add onion and cook until golden. Add remaining in-

gredients. Simmer over low heat for 30 minutes. Serve on Hamburg buns, plain or toasted!

Soupy Chops

Brown chops in heavy skillet. Pour one can of concentrated soup and ½ cup water over chops. Cover and cook slowly for about 1 hour. Use cream of celery, mushroom, cream of vegetable or tomato soup. Serve with rice. Chicken can be cooked the same way.

Escalloped Pork Chops & Potato

Brown chops in heavy skillet. Add sliced potatoes and onions according to amount needed. Season with salt and pepper. Add water enough to keep chops from sticking. Add small carrots (whole or sliced) if desired. Cover and cook over low heat for 1 hour. Add more water if necessary, during cooking

Spanish Pork Chops

Brown pork chops in heavy skillet. Slice onions over top of chops. Add 4 or 5 good shakes of ketchup and enough water to keep chops from sticking. Cover and cook over low heat until tender (abut 1 hour). Remove chops and add a little more water for gravy if necessary. A few slices of green pepper made be added if desired when onions are added. Same recipe can be made using tomato sauce or stewed tomatoes instead of ketchup

Sloppy Joes

To each pound of Hamburg add:

- 2 Tbsp prepared mustard
- 4 tbsp ketchup
- 1 cup condensed chicken gumbo soup

Fry Hamburg loose (sliced onions may be fried with it). When done, add other ingredients and serve on hot buttered Hamburg rolls.

Stove Top Beans & Meatballs

Mix well 1 lb ground lean beef, ½ cup evaporated milk, 2/3 cup soft bread

crumbs, 1 tsp salt, ¼ tsp pepper. With wet hands, shape into 16 balls. Brown in skillet in 1 Tbsp hot shortening with 1 cup sliced onions. Cover and cook over low heat 10 minutes.

Add mixture of 1 (1lb) can (2 cups) canned baked beans, 1/8 tsp salt, 2 tbsp ketchup, and 1/4 tsp dry mustard. Cover and heat. Makes 4 servings.

Spanish Macaroni

1 cup chopped onion

2 tbsp chili sauce

2 tbsp catsup

Salt and pepper to taste

1 cup stock or broth (canned or dry)

1/4 tsp paprika

½ lb macaroni, spaghetti or noodles (cooked)

Fry onion in a little butter until golden brown. Put all ingredients except macaroni into sauce pan. Add onion and allow mixture to boil gently for 10 minutes. Add macaroni and serve hot.

Unbaked Cookies

2 2/3 cups sugar

1/4 tbsp oleo

Pinch of salt

½ cup milk 5 tbsp cocoa

Boil for 1 minute then add q tsp, vanilla, ½ cup peanut butter. Pour over 2 cups of oatmeal in a bowl, don't beat, barely mix. Drop by tsps. On wax paper. Work fast. (it hardens quickly)

Meatball Chowder

½ lb ground beef

1 can condensed vegetable or minestrone soup

1 soup can water

Season beef with salt and pepper, shape into 12 small meatballs. Brown meatball (use shortening if necessary) and cook for 5 minutes. Pour off excess drippings. Push meatballs to one side; stir in soup and water. Heat; stir now and then. Makes 2-3 servings.

Mock Swiss Steak

¼ cup flour

Dash black pepper

2 tbsp shortening

1 cup water

1/4 tsp salt

1 1 /4 lbs round steak (about 3/4' thick)

1 can condensed vegetable soup

Combine flour, salt, and pepper, Pound into steak with a meat mallet. In large skillet, brown steak on both sides in shortening. Add water, cover and cook over low heat until meat is tender. (about 45 minutes). Remove cover, cook down excess liquid. Pour in vegetable soup. Heat.
