The Salvation Rosary can help us to prepared for the "Missionary Life of the Church." You could use your fingers for the prayers so that it can be said anywhere.) Mysteries could be said: Joyful, Mon. & Sat.; Sorrowful, Tues. & Fri.; Light, Thur.; Glorious, Wed. & Sun. Faith Belief is (FB)

The Glorious Mysteries

January 1, 2023

1st The Resurrection

- 1. Our absolute faith belief is: after three Days, God raised Jesus from the dead, on a Sunday the first day of the week, which is why we call it our Sabbath day. MT 28:6
- 2. The women go to the tomb with burial spices containing myrrh. Two young men said: "Do not be afraid, Jesus has been raised from the dead." LK 24:4 & MK 16:5
- 3. Peter and John run to the grave. They see the empty tomb with the burial shroud and face cloth, now they believe Jesus was raised from the dead. JN 20:3
- 4. Jesus first appears to Mary Magdala outside of the tomb and he said to her: "Woman, why are you weeping," and when she recognized Jesus, he said to her: "Do not cling to me, for I have not yet ascended to the Father." JN 20:15
- 5. The same day, Jesus appears to the two on the road to Emmaus and sat down to supper with them, before he vanished from their sight. LK 24:13
- 6. They immediately return to Jerusalem saying Jesus is alive, they recognized Him in "The Breaking of the Bread", which today we call this "The Mass". LK 24
- 7. Jesus came through locked doors and said to them "Peace be with you. See my hands, my feet, and my side. I am not a ghost." Then he ate a piece of baked fish in front of them, so they could see that he was fully human. JN 20:19 & LK 24:36
- 8. Jesus gave His apostles the authority to forgive all people their sins when he says: "Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them and whose sins you retain are retained." Today only Catholic Priests maintain this authority with absolute confidentiality. JN 20:23
- 9. The second time Jesus appeared, again through locked doors and said, "Peace be with you," and doubting Thomas says: "My Lord and My God." JN 20:29
- 10. Now they could all see he was fully spiritual, and Jesus says: "Blessed are those who have not seen me and have believed." If we truly believe, we will try to live our lives in loving service and justice for all "The People of God." JN 20:29

The Ascension

- The apostles go to Galilee to wait, as Jesus appears to more than five hundred other disciples. For 40 days he was miraculously both fully physical and fully spiritual.1 COR 15:6
- 2. The third time, Jesus appeared to the disciples is when they were fishing on the Sea of Galilee and he performs another miracle of many fish in the net. JN 21:4
- 3. They go to shore and Jesus feeds them a breakfast of bread and fish, as they share some of the 153 fish they caught, which represents all the nations they knew in their known universe, and this means "Catholic." JN 21:12
- 4. Three times Jesus asks Peter: "Do you love me?" Remembering he denied knowing him three times. He says: "Be a good shepherd and care for the lambs and sheep of my flock.", which again gave Peter leadership of His universal or Catholic Church JN 21:15
- 5. Jesus also tells Peter: "When you are young, you dress yourself and go where you want. When you are old, someone else will tie you down and take you where you do not want to go.", which can indicate what type of death we may also suffer someday, even when we try to stay faithful JN 21:18
- 6. Jesus tells his disciples he must go to the Father, only then will he be able to send the Holy Spirit, who will teach and guide you to all truth. JN 16:7-13
- 7. He gives his disciples the power to drive out demons, lay hands on the sick, and cure them. All of His followers have this authority to this very day. MK 16:17
- 8. Jesus establishes His missionary church for ever, when he says: "Make disciples in all nations, baptize them in the Name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, and teach them everything I have commanded you to do, and know I am with you always until the end of the world." MT 28:19
- 9. Jesus led his disciples to a mountain to continue to teach them, and as they watched, Jesus Ascended up into the clouds. Acts 1:9
- 10. Two men, dressed in white garments, stood with them, and said: "Jesus was taken into Heaven," so they went back to Jerusalem to wait for the Holy Spirit. Acts 1:11

 Descent of the Holy Spirit
- 1. The first day of the week Jesus' Mother Mary and one hundred twenty (120) disciples gathered in the upper room for the "Breaking of the Bread". Acts 1:13
- 2. At this Pentecost, the Holy Spirit came down with a mighty roar and appeared as tongues of fire above all the disciples' heads. Acts 2:3
- 3. They all spoke in tongues praising God for a vision of their new mission. Now, for the first time, they all had unity of their minds and spirit. Acts 2:4
- 4. Filled with the power of the Holy Spirit, on this the Birthday of the Catholic Christian Church, at the 3 o'clock hour, Peter and John go up to the Temple to pray. Acts 3:1
- 5. Now the Holy Spirit works through Peter and John to heal a poor crippled beggar at the Temple gate. This man could not enter the Temple because he was seen as sinful. They knew the "Jesus of History," now they experience the "Christ of Faith," which many believe is His Second Coming. Acts 3:2 & JN16:16
- 6. They tell the Jews, this man was not healed by them, but through Jesus, the Lord and Messiah, who they had crucified. Acts 3:2
- 7. The Temple guards arrest the apostles for teaching that God raised Jesus, the Christ, from the dead, as the Jewish leaders try to stop Christianity. Acts 4:1
- 8. An angel frees them from prison and they tell the Jews: "We must obey God rather than men.", which is still His teaching for all generations. Acts 5:1+19 +5:19
- 9. The apostles rejoiced that they were flogged and found worthy to suffer for Christ, as they understood more clearly the last Beatitudes, as they suffer persecution for the faith. If we do not suffer some persecution For the Faith, are we living out our Faith to its fullest? Acts 5:40
- 10. Filled with the Holy Spirit, they returned to teach in the Temple, because they are no longer afraid. Now Peter remembers Jesus gave him the Keys to the Church with the undisputed authority to build His Kingdom on earth as it will last forever. This authority is passed on to all popes to this very day. Acts 5:42 + MT 16:19

th The Assumption

- 1. The Virgin Mary lived the rest of her life safe and secure in the community of John, the beloved disciple as she reflected in her heart on the stories with Jesus. JN 19:26
- 2. Mary experienced Jesus' resurrection and his promise of eternal life, as she also witnessed the missionary growth of His Church. JN 20:19
- 3. After sharing with many disciples her life story with Jesus, The Virgin Mary enters her final sleep and she dies as religious tradition teaches. (FB)
- 4. The Church officially believes that Mary is the Mother of God and in faith we believe she also suffered through (7) seven sorrows. LK1:32 (FB)
- 5. The Church officially believes that Mary was conceived without sin in her Immaculate Conception, which Mary herself confirmed this her appearances at Lourdes and for the Miraculous Medal at Paris in the 1800's and we celebrate this on Dec 8. (Pope Pius XII) (FB)
- 6. Jesus knows he was conceived by the Holy Spirit and born by the Blessed Virgin Mary and that he was fully human and fully divine. LK 1:30
- 7. The Church officially believes that Mary remained a virgin until the very day when she was buried and sealed in her tomb. Mary only had intimate "relations" of affection with Joseph but never "came to know each other" which in the Bible for 2000 years, this has meant sexual relations. MT 1:25 (FB))
- 8. It is believed that when they opened Mary's tomb to transfer her bones, it was found empty, so no one ever looked for her bones again. (FB))
- 9. The Church officially believes God Assumed Mary, body and soul, into Heavenly Glory and that her body was never corrupted, as seen in Revelations. (Pius XII) (FB)
- 10. The day of the Assumption is declared by the Church as August 15th, as many believe this was the day they opened her tomb and found it empty. (FB)

th The Coronation

- 1. The Virgin Mary "the woman", enters Heaven where was lightning, thunder, violent storms, and earthquakes. Rev 11:19, 12:1
- 2. After more than 600 years of being lost, in Revelations, John has a vision of The old Ark of the Covenant, now seen in God's Holy Temple in heaven. Rev 11:19 (FB)
- 3. Mary is received into the presence of God and Jesus before The Thrones for the twenty-four (24) elders, which we call this seeing God, "The Beatific Vision". Rev 4:4 (FB)
- 4. Mary, the Queen Mother and as mother of Christ the King, she also takes her throne forever on the right side of God and Jesus. (FB))
- 5. Jesus, the new Adam, places the crown with twelve (12) stars on His mother's head, symbolizing she is now Queen of the Universe. Cor 15:45 (FB)
- 6. Mary is now seen as the new Eve, and is clothed with the sun and with the moon under her feet, as shown on the picture of "Our Lady of Guadalupe," which Mary herself presented in Mexico in 1531. With this miracle, God is showing all the peoples of the world, that :"Nothing will be impossible with God." Rev 12:1 (FB)
- 7. Mary who carried the Christ child in her Womb is now seen as the Ark of the New Covenant and she is declared Queen of Heaven and Earth. She is also called: "The Immaculate Heart of Mary" and "Our Lady of the Rosary" which Mary herself confirmed at Fatima, Portugal in 1917 Rev 12:2 + (FB)
- 8. Jesus gives His mother Mary, "The Woman" her important role in asking God for humanity's redemption. Rev 17:18 (Saint John Paul II's Do Not Be Afraid.) (FB)
- 9. From ancient times our faith tradition believes that Mary can now intercede for us in Heaven, and she can appear at any time on earth. (Lumen Gentium) (FB)
- 10. The Church, the New Jerusalem, and the Body of Christ, recognizes the Coronation of Mary in Heaven, and we celebrate on August 22nd. It is welcomed that there will always be people who are "pro-test-ants" against some traditions of the Catholic Christian Faith. Rev 21:1 (Pius XII) (FB)
