The Joyful Mysteries

January 1, 2023

1 st	Annunciation 1. Mary, as a very young woman, was praying at home in Nazareth and the angel Gabriel appeared to her. Lk 1:30 2. He announces to her “Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with you. Do not be afraid Mary for you have found favor with God. Rejoice” Lk 1:30 3. He said you will conceive and bear a son and you are to name him Jesus, for he will be called “Son of the Most High.” With this announcement the Church believes Mary was full of grace and without Original Sin, so that Jesus could be born without any trace of sin, “Mary’s Immaculate Conception.”. Lk 1:31 4. He will be given The Throne of David his father and his Kingdom will have no end. The angel’s words would fulfill the 1000 year old promise for coming of the Messiah of God. Lk1:32 5. Mary does not understand, and she asks, “How can this be, since I have no relations with a man?” Lk 1:34 6. He said: “The Holy Spirit will come upon you and the power of the Most High will over-shadow you and He will be called Holy, The Son of God.” Lk 1:35 7. He also said: “Elizabeth, your relative, has conceived a son in her old age, and this is the sixth month, for her who was called baron.” Lk 1:36 8. Mary did not know that this child would be called John and he would prepare the way for her Son Jesus, who would become the messiah. (FB) 9. He said: “For nothing would be impossible for God.”, which Jesus later repeats. Not believing this would be curing the Holy Spirit. Lk 1:3,Mt 9:23, Jer.32:17 10. Mary said: “Behold I am the servant of the Lord. May it be done to me according to your word.” Lk 1:38
2 nd	Visitation 1. The Angel Gabriel appears to Zachariah the priest in the temple and said: “Do not be afraid.”, as he prepares to answer to Zachariah’s prayers. Lk 1:13 2. He said: “A son will be born to you, you are to name him John.” Zachariah did not believe his words because he was so old, so God allowed him to suffer a penance and purgatory here, as he prepares him for a new way of life. He was left speechless until the proper time. Lk 1:20 3. Mary arose and went in haste on the long journey into the hill country to visit her cousin Elizabeth and also see this miraculous event that was revealed to her. Lk 1:39 4. Elizabeth said: “Hail Mary full of grace, The Lord is with you, blessed are you among women and blessed is the fruit of your womb.” Lk 1:42 5. Elizabeth also said to Mary: “When the sound of your greeting reached my ears: “The infant in my womb leaped for joy.” Lk 1:41 6. Mary proclaims her “yes” in The Magnificat, which is her joyful hymn of praise to God. Together they trust in God’s will. Lk 1:46 7. At the birth of John, it was said: “The Lord has shown great mercy to this family and the people rejoiced, as they asked, what will this child be.” Lk 1:57 8. On the eighth day, for the Jewish custom of the ritual of the law, his mother said his name was John, but her decision was questioned, because she was a woman, and they were often seen as property of the men and not taken seriously. Lk 1:59 9. Zachariah wrote on a tablet saying his name is John and then he was able to speak again, and he proclaimed his joyful hymn of Praise to God. Lk 1:67 10. Mary remained with Elizabeth for about three months visiting and learning to care for her and the baby John, then she went home. Lk 1:56
3 rd	The Birth of Jesus 1. The angel Gabriel spoke to Joseph in a dream: “Do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife, for she has conceived a child Through the Holy Spirit.” MT 1(FB)) 2. “She will bear a Son and you are to name him Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins.” Joseph “the just man,” remains in silence, but follows in faith and trust as he believed God was calling him . MT 1:21 3. In Bethlehem there was no room in the inn, so this homeless family went and stayed in the stable because no one would offer a poor family shelter “The Posada” in Spanish. The same thing happens to the less fortunate, millions of times a day throughout the world. Lk 2:7 4. Mary gave birth to Jesus, and because they were poor, she wrapped him in rags, and laid him in a manger, which was a feeding trough for animals. Lk 2:7 5. The angel appeared to the shepherds in the fields and said: “Do not be afraid, in the City of David, a Savior has been born, who is Christ the Lord.” Lk 2:8 6. The shepherds went in haste to Bethlehem and found Jesus in the manger and they believed the angel that this child was The Lord and Messiah. Lk 2:16 7. On the eighth day the baby was presented to the priest to perform the custom of the ritual of the law, and he was given the name of Jesus, which means “God is with us.” Lk 2:21 8. The wise men followed the star, and at Jerusalem, they said they were seeking the newborn King of the Jews, and Herod sent them on to Bethlehem. MT2:1 9. The wise men did Jesus homage and gave him gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh, and after a dream, they had been warned not to go back to Herod. We are also reminded of these symbolic gifts, passed onto us as we place the Wise Men’s initial above our blessed home door-posts.: C-M-B. MT 2:11 10. The angel spoke to Joseph in a dream and said: “Rise, take the child and his mother and flee to Egypt, Herod wants to destroy the child. MT 2:13
4 th	The Presentation 1. King Herod sends soldiers to Bethlehem to kill all the babies of Holy innocence, as they became the first martyrs for Jesus Christ. MT2:16 2. As the Holy Family pass through Jerusalem on the 40 th day after Jesus’ birth, they went up to the temple to fulfill the Jewish law. Lk 2:22, Ex 13 & LV12 3. In keeping with a Jewish Holy Family tradition of tithing, they would have shared some of their gold with the poor. (FB) DT 26:12 4. The Holy Family would have also shared some of their gifts by giving to the temple offerings. Dt 14:28 (FB) & NM 3:47 5. In keeping with the Jewish laws of purification and thankfulness to God, they offered in sacrifice two turtle doves to God at the high altar. Lk 2:24 & EX13 6. They met Simeon in the temple who took the baby Jesus into his arms, gave thanks to God, and said this child is the long-prophesized Messiah.” Lk 2:25 7. He also told Mary she would suffer great sorrow, like being pierced with a sword through her heart. The pain of these sorrows would be so great, that it would feel like cutting into her heart. Lk 2:35 8. In the temple, Anna the prophetess tells them the child is the redeemer of his people. This spiritual mother prayed always and offered her hospitality. Lk 2:36 9. To fulfill the Jewish law of sacrifice, the parents of Jesus presented and dedicated him to God in the temple before the Holy of Holies. Lk 2:22 & NM 3:37 10. The poor Holy Family, now with the valuable gifts presented by the wise men, can depart into exile for Egypt, as the angel had told Joseph to do. MT 2:13
5 th	Finding the Child Jesus in the temple. 1. The Holy Family remained in Egypt, migrant-aliens until the angel speaks to Joseph in a dream and announces: “Herod is dead, go back to Israel.” MT 2:19 2. Now the child Jesus is seen as the new Moses, coming out of Egypt, and when they arrive in Judea, they learn that the brutal Herod’s son is now king. These evil Kings would kill anyone they thought could be a threat to their earthly power. MT 2:19-22 3. Joseph is warned in a dream by the angel who told him to go back to live in Nazareth in the territory of Galilee which was out of the control of Herod. MT2::22 4. Mary, Joseph and their families taught Jesus their loving Jewish religion and how to read and write because they had no schools. (FB) 5. Joseph, who would have known he was Jesus’ adoptive father, teaches him how to read the scrolls in the synagogue and the work of carpentry. (FB) 6. To fulfill the Jewish law, the twelve-year-old Jesus was taken on the long journey to Jerusalem for the Passover celebration. Lk 2:41 7. After the Passover was over, and because of misunderstandings, Jesus was lost and his parents searched for three days, finding him in the temple. Lk 2:44 8. Jesus was sitting with the teachers of the law, listening, and asking them questions, and they were amazed to find a child with such wisdom. Lk 2:46 (FB) 9. Mary said: “Son, why have you done this to us?” He said: “Why were you looking for me? Did you not know I must be in my Father’s house?” This was a continuation of Jesus’ lifelong closeness with his Father in heaven, as he learned to say and do God’s will. Lk 2:48 (FB) 10. Jesus went home with his parents, and he was obedient to them. He grew in wisdom and grace before God and man, as the Holy Spirit and His community of faith guided him through his silent years.
