Shooting Campout – Saturday-Sunday, May 7-8, 2022 – Cottey Ranch

This is one of our most popular campouts, so we expect high attendance. Life and Eagle Scouts will be allowed to come on Friday night to help set up the ranges. The rest of the troop will depart from LTMS near the tennis courts on Saturday morning at 8:00 am sharp to arrive at the ranch at 9:00 am. Please arrive early. We expect all scouts to stay for the entire campout. There is a lot of cleanup involved. Departing early and leaving other scouts to clean up the mess is not the Scout way. Any scout who absolutely needs to leave early must get approval from the Scoutmaster and will be expected to perform extra cleanup duty.

We will do patrol cooking. Patrol grubmasters will be chosen by their patrols at the April 25 troop meeting. Bats will eat separately. If you already paid for the campout in February, you will not have to pay to register again for the makeup date.

We will have multiple stations at the campout: Rifles, Shotgun, a Trail to First Class station, and a Mother's Day station. The gun cleaning station will be on Sunday morning before departure. First year scouts will not be able to do shotguns yet. We would like for you to grow a bit and get stronger before attempting to shoot clays.

Finally, registration is due on the Wednesday night before all campouts. This gives the grubmasters time to finalize numbers and buy the correct amount of food.

A huge thank you goes to Dr. Cottey for allowing us to use his ranch once again.

Tonkawa Lodge Spring Assembly - May 1-3, 2022

For the first time in two years, we are back to our normal two-night Assembly weekend format. Tonkawa Lodge Assemblies are opportunities for those elected to become members of the Order of the Arrow. Assemblies normally take place at Lost Pines Scout Reservation in Bastrop. Commonly known as The Ordeal, candidates will meet a series of challenges that will foster self-reflection and test their commitment to a life of cheerful service. For existing members, Assembly Weekend offers a chance to build friendships and serve Scouting in meaningful ways.

New candidates, you will receive a Candidate Information Packet in your email. Please read through the Candidate Information Packet as it contains important details for the weekend. Your dues for 2022 are included with your registration fee. Existing members must have paid their annual dues to attend Assembly. You may pay your dues upon arrival if they haven't already been paid. We are back to pre-COVID operating conditions. That means we are no longer requiring any COVID-related documents to attend events. Swim Test – Nitro Swimming – 11:30 am, May 14, 2022

Each year, scouts must recertify at the BSA swim test. It is a requirement for all aquatic activities, including summer camp, the canoeing campout, kayaking activities on Lake Travis, Sea Base, and any other activities involving swimming or water. Completing the swim test is

also Requirement 6A for earning First Class. This year, we are pleased once again to do our swim test at Nitro in Bee Cave, located at 15506 West Hwy 71 #D, Bee Cave, TX 78738. The test moves quickly, so don't be late. We use multiple lanes at the pool. Both scouts and adults must take the swim test. We ask for a \$5 donation to give to the Nitro employees as a tip.

The requirements are: Jump feetfirst into water over the head in depth. Level off and swim 75 yards in a strong manner using one or more of the following strokes: sidestroke, breaststroke, trudgen, or crawl; then swim 25 yards using an easy resting backstroke. The 100 yards must be completed in one swim without stops and must include at least one sharp turn. After completing the swim, rest by floating.

Scouts who complete this are classified as swimmers. Scouts who can swim only 25 yards are classified as beginners. Anyone who does not take the swim test is labeled a non-swimmer.



Scouts, providing service in our community is a very important part of being a Scout. There are many different ways you can offer your service to our community. Our Troop encourages all Scouts to participate in Eagle service projects when they occur. Someday you will have an Eagle project that will need other scouts' help so you can pay it forward by helping them out! Scouts may also take part in individual Service Hours projects in our community, for example, volunteering at a local church or nonprofit organization. Pre-approval is always required for service projects that take place outside of our Troop. The Service Committee (Cara Cooper and Victoria Dawson) can sign off on your service hours as well as any Scoutmaster or Assistant Scoutmaster. We have a newly updated *Community Service Hours* form you can use if you are interested in completing service hours outside of Troop sponsored or Eagle projects. It is available on our website under Documents. As a reminder, always record and get sign off for all of your service hours. Keep track of your Service Log in your paper Scoutbook as well as under the "Activity Log" in our electronic Scoutbook. As a reminder here are the service hour requirements for our troop. Remember, Scout service hours may also be used for things like Cavs in Service, NHS, NJHS, or others.

Service Hours Requirement by Rank:

- Tenderfoot Class Rank (1 Hour)
- Second Class Rank (2 Hours)
- First Class Rank (3 Hours)
- Star Rank (6 Hours)
- Life Rank (6 Hours including 3 conservation-related hours)
- Eagle Rank (Eagle Service Project)



Trail to First Class Activities – Starting April 9, 2022 – 9:00-11:00 am

Each month Mr. Schulenberg will be hosting Trail to First Class workshops at Lakeway City Park. Beginning on April 9, these workshops will take place on the second Saturday of every month from 9-11 AM at the upper pavilion. We will focus on rank advancement skills and knowledge from Scout through First Class. All scouts are welcome to join in, to listen, learn, and participate. For the older scouts, this is an opportunity to earn rank advancement by helping to lead these sessions by demonstration the EDGE method.

During these 2 hour sessions we will work together through each of the requirements in Scout, Tenderfoot, Second Class, and First Class, including some of the more challenging activities such as first aid, knots, fire building, nature hikes, and the physical fitness requirements. Our goal is to have fun and learn from each other.

Good news! We were able to secure a spot for Sea Exploring on a tall ship for Sea Base in March 10-18, 2023. **Registration is now open in the store section of the troop web site.** The first payment of \$150 per person secures your spot. Spots will fill up fast, so please register quickly.

The minimum age for this trip is 13 years old. This will require extra travel expenses for flights to and from Miami.

The cost would be \$100 per attendee (both scout and adult) with everything included (wetsuit, booties, life jacket, etc.). This is additional to the payment already made for Summer Camp. The deadline for paying for Whitewater Rafting will be April 10th. After that we will be finalizing the roster and won't be able to add any more rafters. Adults and scouts who attend would be the same \$100 amount to raft. Proof of passing the scout swimming qualification must be completed prior to rafting.
