Positions of Responsibility (POR) Changeover

Scouts, we will elect new leaders to serve in Positions of Responsibility (PORs) to begin their terms on July 1, 2022. We will open nominations at the June 6 troop meeting. Troop 52 uses the following PORs: Patrol Leader, Assistant Senior Patrol Leader, Senior Patrol Leader, Troop Guide, Order of the Arrow Troop Representative, Den Chief, Scribe, Quartermaster, Bugler, Junior Assistant Scoutmaster, Chaplain Aide, and Webmaster. In order to receive credit for all PORs, a scout must attend at least 50% of troop meetings and 50% of campouts during the POR term in order to satisfy the requirement of "serve actively in your troop." Senior Patrol Leader candidates will interview with the Scoutmaster for the position. SPL candidates shall email the Scoutmaster a brief letter stating their qualifications and availability schedule for interviews. Candidates who have taken NYLT will be given strong preference for positions. PORs will report to various troop leadership to sign off on their fulfillment of their duties. POR selections will close at night on June 26, 2022.

Afghani Refugee Families and American Cultures Merit Badge – July 16 and August 13, 2022, 2:30 – 6:30 pm – South Austin Community Center, 1100 Cumberland Rd.

Scouts, we have two very special dates coming up where our troop has been asked by the Ladies of Charity service group at Emmaus to assist them in some volunteer work with some Afghani refugee families who were evacuated to the United States, right here in Austin. These families have endured much after the fall of Kabul, Afghanistan last year. We are going to spend two afternoons with our scouts hosting them at a community center in South Austin, 1100 Cumberland Road, playing games and showing scout spirit. The Ladies of Charity will host the adults while the Scouts and Scouters will host the children who are approximately five to ten years old. After the games and activities, we will have a picnic lunch outside. The LOC have requested that our scouts teach them American games and show how they have fun, so bring an appropriate game or a soccer ball and be prepared to be a good cultural ambassador. We have been requested to cook for them, so we will be asking the scouts to cook hot dogs that are halal and serve various sides and drinks. Please RSVP on the troop calendar. We need ideas for games to play at the community center like basketball or relay races. Soccer inside might be an option. We do not want the boys sitting idle waiting for a turn. Understanding Troop vs Community Service Hours

During these 2 hour sessions we will work together through each of the requirements in Scout, Tenderfoot, Second Class, and First Class, including some of the more challenging activities such as first aid, knots, fire building, nature hikes, and the physical fitness requirements.
