Summer Camp Notes

Camp Alexander - Lake George, Colorado: June 14-22

Join us for the 2025 summer camp. Camp A is an excellent place to attend, especially to get out of the Texas heat for a week. Scouts will work on merit badges and rank advancement. There will be opportunities to go whitewater rafting, rock climbing, and many outdoor activities.

Each scout and adult has a total cost of \$725 and \$625, respectively. The first payment of \$250 is due on or before Nov. 1. Second payment of \$250 is due on or before Jan. 15, 2025, and the balance of \$225/Scout and \$125/Adult is due March 15, 2025



While the Scouts prepare for the weekend campout, the parents will meet to answer any questions you have about the Troop and the Program. This will be an opportunity for all parents of all experience to understand better how the Troop functions and how imperative we have Parent participation to keep Troop 52 as successful as it has always been. We look forward to seeing you there!

The Parents' Role

In Boy Scouts, leaders and parents provide support. The Scouts plan the meetings and events. We help with guidance, resources, and support. It is tempting to jump in when your son or another boy is struggling. Our leaders are trained in coaching and providing enough support so the struggle becomes a learning experience. Our objective is to teach them teamwork and leadership. The Senior Patrol Leader, his assistants, and the individual Patrol Leaders lead the troop. The troop operates by the "patrol method," using the patrol as the core operational element. If your son has questions, they are first directed to the Patrol Leader and then to the Senior Patrol Leader. If you are patient, sit back, and watch, you will see an amazing transformation.

A fundamental principle of Scouting is that troops be boy-led. However, for the Scouting program to be successful, parents NEED to be involved. It doesn't matter whether your job is big or small, help is needed from every adult. There are many different roles to fill and ways to contribute. We need your help supporting an activity, teaching a skill, and helping with advancement. Your involvement can be as expansive or as limited as your schedule allows, but we encourage you to get involved. We require that all parents register with the Troop/BSA in order to go on trips and that they take BSA Youth Protection Training online.
