Bunkers del Carmel

One of the best panoramic viewpoints in Barcelona, especially at sunset. Far less touristy than Park Güell and beloved by locals.

Palau Dalmaes

A hidden 17th-century palace offering intimate flamenco performances in a stunning historic setting.

Sant Pau Art Nouveau Site

Often overshadowed by the Sagrada Família, this beautifully restored modernist complex is one of the city's architectural treasures.

El Born Side Streets

Wander the smaller lanes around El Born to discover artisan shops, hidden wine bars, quiet courtyards, and local cafés away from the crowds.

Biblioteca Arús

A fascinating hidden library featuring Victorian interiors and one of Europe's largest Sherlock Holmes collections.

Top Things to Do

Visit the Sagrada Família

Sagrada Família

Gaudí's masterpiece is one of the most extraordinary churches in the world. Book skip-the-line tickets well in advance and consider a guided tour for deeper insight into symbolism and architecture.

Tip! Take your time here. During my visit in January 2026, I found myself wanting to spend time just soaking in the energy and unique architecture this wonderful cathedral had to offer. As one of the world's largest, and most unique cathedrals that is *still under construction*, I found myself connecting with the themes and stories Gaudí was telling in ways I never imagined. A guided tour really isn't needed if you have your phone and connection to the internet. My advice would be to visit on your own and take your time. Don't miss the underground original foundation area, which is just down some stairs when you exit the cathedral!

Explore Park Güell

A colorful hilltop park filled with whimsical mosaics, curved architecture, and incredible city views.

Wander the Gothic Quarter

Explore medieval alleys, Roman ruins, hidden courtyards, and lively plazas filled with musicians and cafés.

Legendary seafood tapas spot where chefs prepare dishes based on the freshest daily ingredients.

More Gaudí Masterpieces to Visit in Barcelona

Beyond the famous Sagrada Família and Park Güell, Barcelona is filled with incredible works by Antoni Gaudí that showcase his unique blend of architecture, nature, color, and imagination.

Casa Batlló

Casa Batlló

One of Gaudí's most iconic creations, Casa Batlló is famous for its flowing organic shapes, colorful mosaic façade, and dreamlike interiors inspired by the sea. The rooftop's dragon-scale design is one of the city's most photographed architectural details.

Personal Experience! Don't miss this. My wife and I decided to add this to our visit "on a whim" and we are glad we did. Get your tickets from their website early and enjoy one of the hidden gems of Barcelona. The way Gaudi designed the air vents to naturally cool the building or incorporated the feel of the ocean throughout the design was truly inspiring. Be aware, there are lots of stairs but if needed, you can take a central lift to the higher floors. Just ask!

Colònia Güell Crypt
