Lisbon cruise ships commonly use terminals near Santa Apolónia and Jardim do Tabaco, placing guests close to Alfama, Praça do Comércio, Baixa, and Chiado.

Tips:

- Alfama is very close to the cruise area but hilly and cobbled
- Baixa and Chiado are easier for most first-time visitors
- Taxis, Uber, and Bolt are helpful with luggage
- The Santa Apolónia area has train and metro access
- Confirm the exact terminal before arranging transfers
- Private transfers are recommended for guests with luggage or mobility concerns

A good food tour helps visitors discover classic dishes, local bakeries, wine bars, markets, and hidden family-run restaurants that can be hard to find independently.

A Lisbon favorite, especially during summer festivals.

Portuguese small plates similar in spirit to tapas, often paired with wine.

Ginjinha

Sweet cherry liqueur often served in tiny glasses, sometimes in chocolate cups.

Canned Seafood

High-quality Portuguese conservas, including sardines, tuna, octopus, and mackerel.

Excellent reds, whites, vinho verde, and port-style fortified wines.

 - Private tours are best for guests with mobility concerns.
 - Come hungry — portions can add up quickly.
 - Let the operator know about shellfish, pork, alcohol, gluten, or dairy restrictions.
 - Evening tours pair especially well with fado.
 - Morning tours work well before Belém or Sintra sightseeing.
