GOVERNOR'S SILENCE ON ILLEGAL CONFINEMENT OF CALIFORNIA'S PRISONERS SPEAKS VOLUMES!

Sacramento, CA. Demand that the Governor order the immediate and unconditional release from the state prison of all unindicted persons receives tacit approval!

On April 17, 2020 demand for the release of all state prison inmates wrongly imprisoned was made by a decorated Vietnam veteran on behalf of all. The case was made that both the state and federal constitutions require indictment by a grand jury as a condition precedent for confinement in the state prison. Research presented to the Governor evidences that the majority of persons currently confined in the state prison are not indicted.

The revelation of the Constitutional violation places the state in the proverbial and unenviable position of "between a rock and a hard place". Publicly acknowledging the law is correct, admits the state's illegal conduct and requires immediate action. Remaining silent, while buying some time, equates to fraud and implicates the Governor and involved state officers in a criminal conspiracy, e.g., violation of their oath of office to support and defend both constitutions; continued false imprisonment, and civil rights violations.

It seems reasonable to expect a man of integrity to immediately choose to follow the law, regardless of the consequences. Particularly one with Presidential aspirations.

The courts have held "Silence can only be equated with fraud where there is a legal or moral duty to speak or where a inquiry left unanswered would be intentionally misleading." U.S. v. Tweel, 550 F.2d 297, 300 (1977). Delay is not a legal or moral option. And, God has already weighed in on the matter: "Free those who are wrongly imprisoned." Isaiah 58:6 (NLT).
