From the Bible:

And it was so. ²⁰Then God said, ``Let the waters teem with fish and other life, and let the skies be filled with birds of every kind." ²⁵God made all sorts of wild animals and cattle and reptiles. And God was pleased with what he had done. From Genesis 1 LVB.

Then God said, ``Let us make a man --someone like ourselves, to be the master of all life upon the earth and in the skies and in the seas." Genesis 1:26 LVB.

All Was Good

God made all things in six days. Then God said it was very good.

Adam, Eve, and the animals lived in a beautiful garden. The garden was called Eden. God gave them yummy fruits and vegetables to eat.

Did you know they did not eat meat back then? It was a perfect world. Animals did not eat meat, either. All lived in peace.

Life After Sin

God was sad that Adam and Eve ate the fruit Satan gave them. God is sad when we do not listen to Him. When we do not listen to God that is called Sin.

Do you think God punished Adam and Eve for sinning? He made them leave the Garden of Eden. God told them that now weeds would grow. God said that they would have to work hard to get food to eat. God told them they would grow old and die.

Do you think Adam and Eve learned their lesson? Did they ever sin again?



The Lord God called to Adam, ``Why are you hiding? Have you eaten fruit from the tree I warned you about?" ``Yes," Adam admitted, ``but it was the woman you gave me who brought me some, and I ate it." Then the Lord God asked the woman, ``How could you do such a thing?'' ``The serpent tricked me," she replied. Then God said to the woman, ``You shall bear children in intense pain and suffering. And to Adam, God said, ``Because you listened to your wife and ate the fruit when I told you not to, I have placed a curse upon the soil. All your life you will struggle to extract a living from it. Condensed from Genesis 3:9-13, 16-17 LVB.

So the Lord God banished him forever from the Garden of Eden, and sent him out to farm the ground from which he had been taken. Thus God expelled him, and placed mighty angels at the east of the Garden of Eden, with a flaming sword to guard the entrance to the Tree of Life. Genesis 3:23-24 LVB.

A Big Flood

Adam and Eve had many children. Their children grew up and had children. Soon people lived all around the world. They knew what happened when Adam and Eve sinned. Were they good all the time to please God?

No! The people of the world did not learn their lesson. They did bad things and sinned many times. How do you think this made God feel?

But guess what else God found. God found a man named Noah and his family. God saw that they loved Him. God made a plan to save them.

And he said, ``I will blot out from the face of the earth all mankind that I created. Yes, and the animals too, and the reptiles and the birds. For I am sorry I made them." Genesis 6:5-7 LVB.

But Noah was a pleasure to the Lord. Here is the story of Noah: He was the only truly righteous man living on the earth at that time. He tried always to conduct his affairs according to God's will. And he had three sons-Shem, Ham, and Japheth. Genesis 6:8-9 LVB.

Make a boat from resinous wood, sealing it with tar; and construct decks and stalls throughout the ship. Make it 450 feet long, 75 feet wide, and 45 feet high. Construct a skylight all the way around the ship, eighteen inches below the roof; and make three decks inside the boat--a bottom, middle, and upper deck--and put a door in the side. ``Look! I am going to cover the earth with a flood and destroy every living being--everything in which there is the breath of life. All will die. But I promise to keep you safe in the ship, with your wife and your sons and their wives. Bring a pair of every animal--a male and a female--into the boat with you, to keep them alive through the flood. Bring in a pair of each kind of bird and animal and reptile. Genesis 6:14-19 LVB.


A Big Tower

After the flood, Noah and his family got off the ark. All the animals got off the ark. Noah and his family were thankful to God. They loved God and God loved them.

Noah's family had many children and grandchildren. God told the people to spread out all over the earth. Some of them built a big city with a tall building. They did this so that could stay together. They did not want to spread out. Do you think God was angry again?

Got already made Adam and Eve leave the Garden of Eden. God already made a big flood. What would He do now?

All the people in the world spoke the same language. Now God made them speak different languages. The people got mixed up and scared. They scattered all over the world.



God told Noah and his sons, ``I solemnly promise you and your children and the animals you brought with you--all these birds and cattle and wild animals--that I will never again send another flood to destroy the earth. Genesis 11:7-9 LVB.

God's People

Noah had a great-grandson. His name was Abraham. Abraham loved God. God was kind to Abraham.

Abraham had a son named Isaac. Isaac was the father of the Jews. God loved the Jews because they loved Him. God promised to take care of them.

God promised to send someone to protect the Jews from their enemies. This someone was called the Messiah. The Messiah would also save them from their sins.

Abraham had a son named Ishmael. He is the father of all Arab nations. Arabs call Abraham the father of their nation, too.



Noah was another who trusted God. When he heard God's warning about the future, Noah believed him even though there was then no sign of a flood, and wasting no time, he built the ark and saved his family. Noah's belief in God was in direct contrast to the sin and disbelief of the rest of the world--which refused to obey--and because of his faith he became one of those whom God has accepted. Hebrews 11:7 LVB.

And even when he reached God's promised land, he lived in tents like a mere visitor, as did Isaac and Jacob, to whom God gave the same promise. Abraham did this because he was confidently waiting for God to bring him to that strong heavenly city whose designer and builder is God. Hebrews 11:8-19 LVB.


And so a whole nation came from Abraham, who was too old to have even one child--a nation with so many millions of people that, like the stars of the sky and the sand on the ocean shores, there is no way to count them. Hebrews 11:12 LVB.

And as for Ishmael, I have blessed him, and will make him fruitful, and will multiply him exceedingly; and I will make him a great nation. But my covenant will I establish with Isaac, which Sarah shall bear unto thee at this set time in the next year. From Genesis 17:20-21 KJV.

Promised Land

Promise of Jesus

The Messiah would save us from our sins. The people used to make sacrifices to God to be forgiven of their sins. God promised that the Messiah would be our sacrifice.

People were often mean to the Jews. God promised that the Messiah would beat their enemies.

For unto us a Child is born; unto us a Son is given; and the government shall be upon his shoulder. These will be his royal titles: ``Wonderful," ``Counselor," ``The Mighty God," ``The Everlasting Father," ``The Prince of Peace." His ever-expanding, peaceful government will never end. He will rule with perfect fairness and justice from the throne of his father David. He will bring true justice and peace to all the nations of the world. This is going to happen because the Lord of heaven's armies has dedicated himself to do it! Isaiah 9:6-7 LVB.

God's Gift

God sent the Messiah. The Messiah was His son. His name is Jesus. Jesus came as an ordinary baby. Mary and Joseph were His parents. They loved Jesus and took good care of Him.

Jesus was born and laid in a manger. A manger is a trough for feeding animals. We call His birthday Christmas. He grew to be very smart. Jesus was special and not like other children. He was the Son of God. Jesus obeyed his parents Mary and Joseph. Most of all He loved God, His Father.

Jesus Lives

His blood ran from His body. His blood ran just like the animal sacrifices people made before Him. His blood was shed to wash our sins away. Did you ever have a pet that died? Did you bury it? We call that day Easter.

The angel said, ``Don't be so surprised. Aren't you looking for Jesus, the Nazarene who was crucified? He isn't here! He has come back to life! Look, that's where his body was lying. Mark 16:6 LVB.



Believe on the Lord Jesus and you will be saved. Acts 16:31 LVB.


