Big Technical Data, the Cloud and Data Residency

The subject of *data residency*, and how the cloud often puts the owners of the data at risk of conflict with transborder data regulations, is heating up. It was discussed in the context of privacy and the public sector during the CSCC Privacy Summit in March. The Object Management Group is convening a formation meeting for a Data Residency working group on June 16 in Berlin. And the Industrial Internet Consortium is looking into the issues generated by the acquisition, storage and processing of sensor data.

Reflecting on all these trends, in particular in the energy industry, the ODBMS journal published an <u>article by Claude Baudoin</u> entitled "Big Technical Data, the Cloud and Data Residency" in a recent issue.
