When I first realized Alma College's graduation was the same weekend as Easter this year, I groaned. Ok - more than groaned - I complained a little bit. As I sat with it, I realized how incredibly appropriate it is - probably because ministers are great at stewing over something until we solve it theologically.

Graduations and Easter have much in common. Both are emotionally full. The disciples weep over the death of Jesus, and they grieve as they arrive early at the tomb, only to be surprised and overjoyed to see him arisen! (Spoiler alert - he doesn't stay in the tomb!)

At commencement, there are tears shed over parting with friends and professors and mentors. There is grief at leaving a place of growth and learning, maybe even growth or regret over things undone, experiences not taken. And there is absolute joy at celebrating the accomplishments from the past four years.

The resurrection represents so much of our lives, our emotions, because God came to be with us humans, to experience life with us, and remind us we aren't alone. Knowing that Jesus has experienced what we have, reminds us we do not go this road alone.

And so as we approach Holy Week let us give ourselves permission to feel all the feelings, express all the emotions, to know that God is with us in all of it. We need not face Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, or Holy Saturday alone, and we especially gather in celebration at the Resurrection.
