"In life and in death, and in all circumstances in life, we belong to God and we belong to each other - thanks be to God for these blessed connections." My former Executive Presbyter, Rev. Susan McGhee, would often end emails or presbytery reports with these words words originating from Romans 14.8 and repeated in the Brief Statement of Faith in our Book of Confessions (with a few additional pastoral words of her own added). These were words of comfort to me, partially because they were repetitive (I find hearing a compassionate message repeated over and over can calm anxieties) but also because I have found it to be true. Even as I opened up one of her emails from nearly a decade ago, I found these words warming my soul.

The Presbyterian Church is a connectional church. This means that we are connected to God, to one another, to creation. We don't live in isolation , because faith is meant to be communal.

One of the questions I often get from people who were raised in the church as children, still believe as adults, but have stopped attending a church, is why they should go when they can pray and read the Bible at home. A great question! The answer I always give is community. We learn and connect with God on an individual level, but we also do so communally. It is in that community that we can seek support, comfort, and understanding of scripture. It is in that community we can also offer support and love.

As you read this I will be in Salt Lake City, Utah for the 226th General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church (USA). I love GA for many reasons - I'm a polity geek, I enjoy the creative worship services, I love learning about the current issues of the church, but it is also a connectional time for me where I run into the various Presbyterians I've met over the course of my life. Sometimes I only see them every two years at General Assembly, but it reminds me I'm not the only one doing this work.

Maybe you need that reassurance once in a while - that you aren't alone, and that we're in this together. My hope and prayer is that you find that space in worship and fellowship. In life and in death, and in all circumstances in life, we belong to God and we belong to each other.
