
First Presbyterian Church of Alma A Note from Rev. Katrina



Ebay Merlin, our organist and collaborative pianist. Ebay was gifted with that nickname 13 years ago by fellow campers at Blue Lake Fine Arts Camp when attending to play clarinet. The reason for the nickname is no longer remembered but it "fits" and is their preferred moniker. Ebay has always been musically inclined, taking after their father who is also a musician. Ebay plays piano and organ for us but also plays clarinet, trombone, bassoon, accordion and hammer dulcimer, and can play flute and saxophone "tolerably". Ebay initially enrolled at CMU majoring in mathematics, flirted briefly with Business Information Systems, and then auditioned for Vocal Music. After two years of intensive study, they presented a portfolio (the equivalent of an "audition") to be accepted as a Music Composition major, and graduated after three years of study. We can find two albums at emryslayne.bandcamp.com, one is a compilation of original piano solos and the other is music electronically composed specifically for their sister's master's thesis in dance. Speaking of their sister, Ebay is the third of four siblings all of whom are living in Michigan and who annually gather for a weekend of fun. Ebay has lived in Mt. Pleasant with their partner of 3 years, Nikola, and 2 cats (Merlin and Arthur).

Ebay openly identifies as transgender and is a strong advocate for the LGBTQ+ community. They are one of the founders of the Mt. Pleasant Pride Center (MPPC) and currently serve as President of the Board of Directors. MPPC is a non-profit organization whose mission is to "empower and uplift the Pride community of Mid-Michigan". We are amazed and grateful to find such an accomplished musician as our organist/pianist, but Ebay says they are the more fortunate in this relationship. Even though their time with us is only part of their musical career which is shared with teaching private lessons in piano and composition, it has provided them with an opportunity to play for a welcoming community and to experience working with a choir. Regardless, we think "this is the beginning of a beautiful friendship" and will keep asking him to "play it again"!
