



Nearer my God to Thee is a 160 year old hymn describing the joy of climbingJacob's Ladder, a pathway stretching from earth to heaven that Jacob saw in a dream. It's never been one of my favorite hymns, in fact it's considered a pretty mournful song and is believed to be the song the Titanic musicians played as the ship went down. I'm not sure that would have given me comfort—hard to see a heavenly ladder arising from a sinking ship when you're feeling terrified. But the foundation of faith that the song is based on gave me a lot of comfort this summer because you, my church family, spent a lot of time thinking about me, praying for me, visiting me, sending me flowers and showering me with cheery cards. I spent a total of 35 days as an inpatient and part of that time I wasn't able to do much of anything on my own and wasn't sure I would leave the hospital alive. When it became clear that I was going to survive, I spent my time listening to music from past glory days and shedding tears for the loss of my right hand -my bow hand. Somewhere I have a little sign that says music is not what I do, it's who I am. Facing the possibility of never playing again was heart-rending. I have been close to death before, my own possible demise in the past as well as the loss of those I loved, and music sustained me through those times. My biological family is quite small but supportive though geographically distant. My music family is huge and making music with them, including musicians here, is how I get through the stresses of life. I started playing long slow scales and hoping I wouldn't drop my bow. I prayed that I would recover enough to at least play chamber music with friends and when that happened I cried tears of joy. This month I performed in the Soo Opera Orchestra, an annual event for me, and I'm back to my quartet and regular orchestras and playing here at church. God has given me back the joy of my life and you all helped me find it. Thank you.


Join us!
