- › BROWNS students move away from the traditional, academic classroom and use what they learn by interaction with other students on the BROWNS campuses or by engaging with the local community outside the campus.

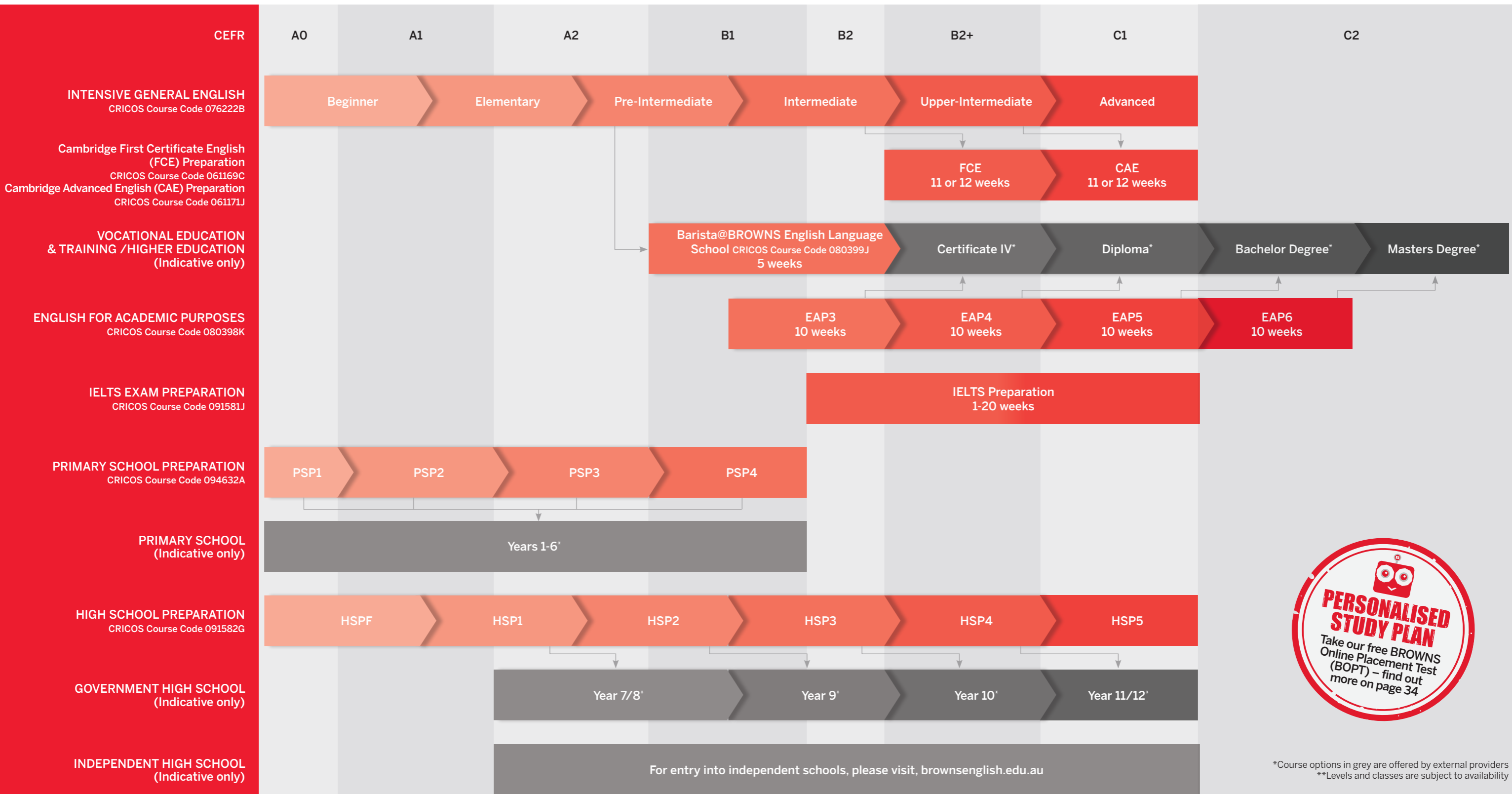

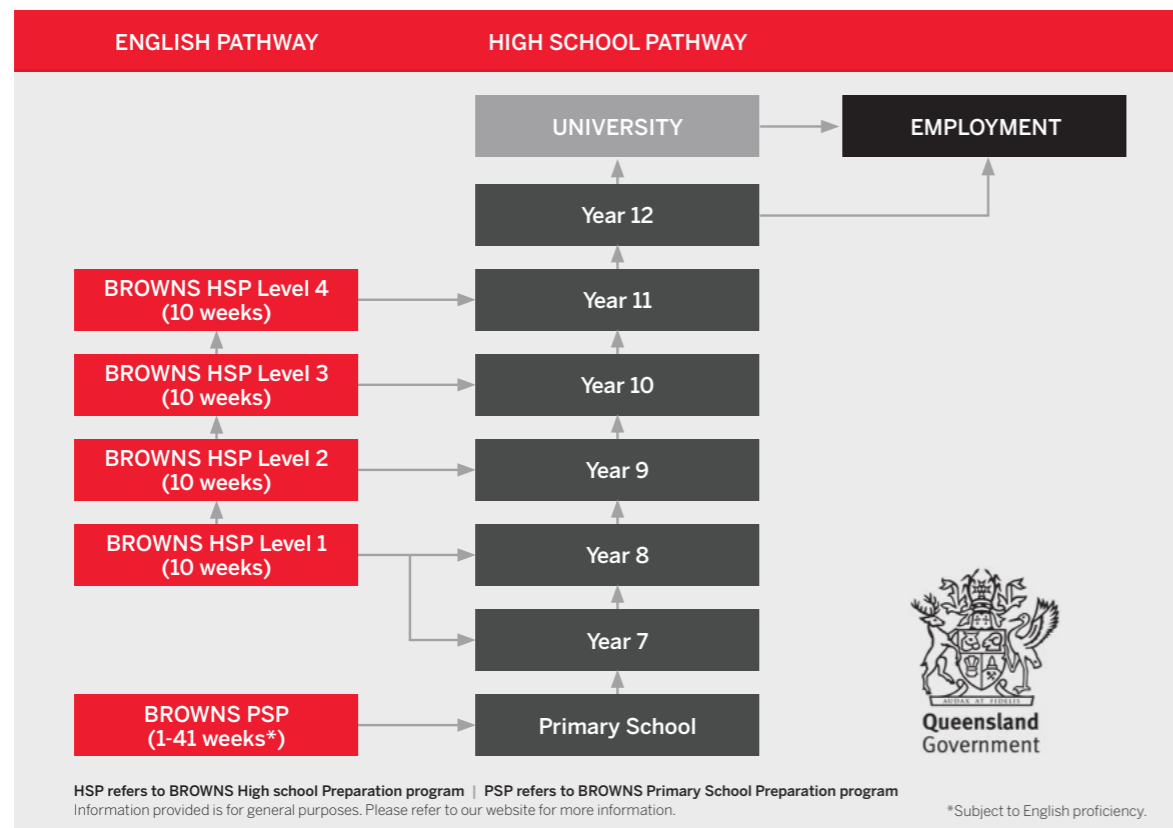

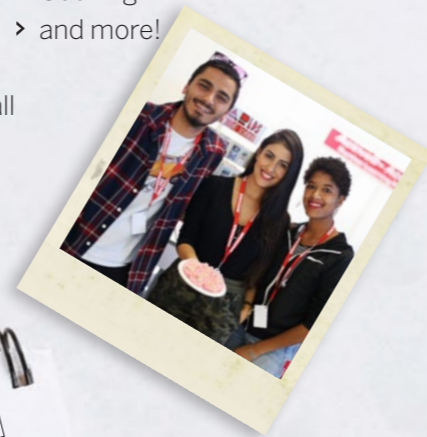
