Barriers Encountered	<p>Starting a child care center, especially center-based care, involves many steps and considerations. Understanding the financial aspects and the time required is crucial, as it's not a quick process. There are numerous factors to consider, and CCR&R Consultants are available to help programs understand more about barriers, current climate, and access resources.</p> <p>Lower adult-to-child ratios can be very beneficial for supporting children with challenging behaviors, though many centers struggle to fund extra staff. Some centers that can afford it at times, have seen improvements, highlighting the importance of more opportunities for individualized attention.</p>
