<p>Barriers Encountered</p>	<p>Delta and Omicron variants. Non vaccinated staff and children are more susceptible to infection. New IDPH guidelines are in place, but confusion continues with interpretation. Adenoviruses and rhinoviruses continue to spread throughout centers and homes. Staffing continues to be a problem for some centers due to illness or staff finding employment elsewhere due to increased salary.</p>
<p>Success Stories</p>	<p>One center has two special needs children with G-Tube feedings. This center is working with each family to provide appropriate care. Staff have been very passionate and accommodating with each child's needs and the children are thriving. CCNC support with QRS health and safety tools has been invaluable for programs to apply and receive some points under that section. There is now a very short window and a time crunch for programs to renew their QRS application before the change in the current system, which will end prior to April 1, 2022.</p>

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
