<p>Barriers Encountered</p>	<p>Covid-19 continues to infect both child care centers and child care homes with COVID-19, Delta and Omicron variants. Non vaccinated staff and children are more susceptible to infection. New IDPH guidelines are in place, but confusion continues with interpretation. Adenoviruses and rhinoviruses continue to spread throughout centers and homes. Staffing continues to be a problem for some centers due to illness or staff finding employment elsewhere due to increased salary.</p>
<p>Success Stories</p>	<p>February is dental health month. The CCNC worked with I-Smile Program and local dentists to provide free dental examinations to children ages 1 - 13 years of age without dental home and/or dental insurance. Toothbrushes were distributed to local child care centers and child care homes for oral health activities.</p>

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
