Barriers Encountered	<p>The barriers Black Hawk faced this fall training season were related to Covid-19. When planning for the fall we needed to keep in mind what Covid-19 protocols would look like as the protocols were still put in place for the safety of the participants, the trainer, and facilitator. The EPI Deery Center Multi-purpose Room capacity is still at 15 participants which continues to be a barrier as providers are in need of training credit and many Black Hawk providers are more interested in attending face to face trainings due to not having access to electronics and/or they do not have computer skills. Therefore, CCR&R is grateful we received funding to be able to continue to provide the option of offering face to face training opportunities for providers who are comfortable to attend and learn better at a face to face training. Additionally, there are still many providers who are still not comfortable coming to face to face trainings, so it has been great to have the opportunity for them to attend virtual trainings throughout CCR&R Region 2.</p>							
Success Stories	<p>During the first quarter, providers were offered approximately 25 virtual standalone/series training opportunities through CCR&R Region 2/ CCR&R Statewide Webinars. Through an online training registry known as I-PoWeR, providers could enroll in any of those virtual trainings. Providers often call the Black Hawk Training Specialist, who lends a hand to assist providers when it comes to searching for virtual trainings, enrolling in a specific training, and/or navigating through the website. Black Hawk offered a two-night face to face series called Physical Activity Learning Session where providers were able to learn about ways they could implement indoor and outdoor activities into their program, they participated in a variety of physical activities throughout the training, and learned how to modify activities based upon abilities and ages. Many providers mentioned they enjoyed being able to come to a face to face training and enjoyed the PALS training. Black Hawk begun their ChildNet 3.0 Series in the 1st quarter, CCR&R is appreciative of the CVP funds we have received to help pay for this series, the trainer who helps providers gain knowledge along with being able to purchase provider incentives that help providers implement activities, resources, and skills they learn throughout this 10-week series into their child care businesses.</p>							

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
