Barriers Encountered	Continued barriers of getting new providers to become Registered. Many people that are seeking info in becoming Registered Child Care homes and many are not interested and don't let Consultants know they are not interested and or do not follow through. We continue to try various ways to support new home providers. We providing face to face meetings and on-going consultation support through the process to become registered and even some health and safety items to meet regulation standards and new start up grant materials that are given once registered. Providers/Programs being open to working with Consultants and also the time to do this within their child care day. Continued need for support for programs that are struggling with children's challenging							

	<p>Continued need for support for programs that are struggling with children's challenging behaviors. It is not a simple and quick solution. Continued staff turn over in the child care field and newer staff's lack of developmentally appropriate practices related to child development impact these challenges.</p>
Success Stories	<p>Consultants have been very busy supporting child care homes with getting registered and center based supporting them through the Licensing & IQ4K process. Both are time intensive and take the motivation of the program to complete. One new home provider was approved for Registration & one provider was denied her Registration. One new Center opened in Cedar Falls. Five new possible providers had their Home Registration applications submitted for HHS approval in Q4. This is exciting to see a lot of follow through by providers this quarter. Four Centers received their IQ4K Level. Two Centers achieved a level 3 and two Centers achieved a IQ4K level 1 rating.</p> <p>Dental/Oral Health information and children's dramatic play dental kits were purchased to support ongoing Quality Improvements and partnership with CCNC going out to programs and doing dental health awareness with programs and kids. This supports child care programs increasing their family and community engagements activities and can help expand health practices that can be used in children's free play and ongoing learning of healthy practices.</p> <p>Continued in person BH Center Director's Networking meetings hosted by CCR&R Monthly small group newer Directors & quarterly April large group Director's meetings have been successful and those that attend are sharing ideas and meaningful peer to peer discussions.</p>
