Barriers Encounter ed	<p>Due to Covid-19; the capacity of 15 participants in the EPI Deery Center Multi-purpose Room is still a barrier, but CCR&R is grateful we received funding to be able to continue to provide the option of offering face to face trainings for providers who thrive and learn better face to face. CCR&R offered these trainings while still following Covid-19 precautions. CCR&R and the EPI Deery Center Multi-purpose Room continues to follow Covid-19 precautions as of July 2021. Having the option to offer virtual trainings on the Zoom platform has created many opportunities for trainers, providers, and CCR&R Staff, but offering virtual training still poses difficulty for any child care providers who do not have access to electronics and/or does not have the proper computer skills. The BH Training Specialist, along with provider relatives & friends, have been able to lend a hand to assist those providers with getting online for a virtual training.</p>							
Success Stories	<p>This quarter, providers were given approximately 20 choices of virtual & face to face trainings through CCR&R Region 2 / CCR&R Statewide Webinars. On the I-PoWeR Training Registry there were virtual options available for providers to receive training credit whether they enjoyed the virtual option more or were not ready to attend trainings face to face.</p> <p>Child Net 3.0 Training Series face to face begun in March and ran through May. Black Hawk alone had 9 providers complete the 10 week ChildNet 3.0 Series virtually and/or face to face. Those providers who completed the CN 3.0 Series and were from Black Hawk were able to receive a ChildNet 3.0 attendance stipend based upon the CVP funds we received. Providers shared with us how much they enjoy being back at a face to face training series again!</p> <p>CCR&R collaborated with Iowa State University Extension and Outreach to offer a new face to face training called "Food Safety Escape Challenge. There was positive feedback from the providers who attended, many mentioned how the class was fun, interactive, and not boring. Additionally, they enjoyed the hands-on-portion and the activities that went along with the class content. There were 5 providers who completed the new School Age Matters training virtually that began in April and ran through May.</p>							

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
