School Ready Funds	<p>Preschool Scholarships Tuition assistance for income eligible families with a 3- or 4-year-old to attend preschool. Assistance is capped at no more than \$300 per student per month. If monthly costs are less than \$300, that amount is reimbursed.</p> <p>Additional programs were approved but did not have children enrolled who qualified.</p> <p>We had a unique opportunity with children attending Hawkeye Community College.
