Barriers Encountered	<p>Low number of people interested in becoming a Registered Home provider and follow through. Consultants have helped in any way they can to support a potential provider. One thing is they offer to come out prior to the HHS Pre -inspections to go over requirements, so the provider understands and is as prepared as possible. Children are coming to care with more needs and experienced trauma, and lack of staff and turnover. Visits have had to be cancelled beacause of staffing needs.</p>							

Success Stories	<p>Consultants have again got into classrooms for the first time to support concerns with challenging behaviors, they've done observations and worked with staff to offer suggestions and strategies. Consultants were able to work with Reg. 2's new Regional Behavioral Health Specialist to support and enhance these efforts. One ex. a classroom teachers shared that after some different environmental changes and other strategies in her room there was a decrease in challenging behaviors.</p> <p>CCR&amp;R has continued to host in person small and 1 large group Child Care Center Director's Peer to Peer meetings, so those in the role as a director, can meet others and connect with a community of practice to network. We offered a in person Child Care Home Peer to Peer meeting, but unfortunately only had 1 provider attend.</p> <p>Two centers received their IQ4K level 1, and one center received their IQ4K level 4, and 2 home provider received their level 1 and another received her level 2. These programs continue to work hard to achieve/renew level on the IQ4K system, and it is a partnership with their local CCR&amp;R Consultant and the IQ4K Specialists Staff.</p> <p>Additional support from Regional funded CCR&amp;R Staff worked with 52 BH programs in Q2</p>
