Count from the morrow after the Shabbat
Wayyiqra 23:15

Shavuot - Feast of Weeks
Counted. Not chosen.

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WELCOME

This guide is for those who desire
to obey YAHUAH in simplicity and truth.

This is about continuing in order.

Not stopping at First Fruits.

What you begin, you finish.

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WHAT IS SHAVUOT

Shavuot is an appointed time of YAHUAH.

It is the Feast of Weeks.

It is not fixed by a date—
it is counted.

From First Fruits,
seven Sabbaths are counted.

Then comes the fiftieth day.

Wayyiqra 23:15–16

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WHEN DOES SHAVUOT OCCUR

Shavuot is not tied to a calendar date.

It is tied to a count.

The count begins
the day after the Sabbath
after First Fruits.

Seven Sabbaths are counted.

Then the next day—
the fiftieth day—
is Shavuot.

This is the appointed time.

Wayyiqra 23:15–16

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THE COUNT

The count is not a ritual.

It is preparation.

Each day is a step forward—
from deliverance
to obedience.

From First Fruits
to fulfillment.

You do not guess. You count.
You do not drift. You prepare.

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WHAT MAKES IT DIFFERENT

Shavuot is the harvest.

It is the time of first increase.

What was counted
is now brought.

An offering is presented
before YAHUAH.

Wayyiqra 23:17

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WHAT IS BROUGHT

An offering is brought
from the harvest.

Two loaves
of fine flour.

Baked with leaven.

Presented before YAHUAH.

Wayyiqra 23:17

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WHY IT MATTERS

Shavuot is not just counted.

It is kept.

What was begun
in obedience
is completed in obedience.

This is how we walk it out.

Obedience is not seasonal.
It is continual.

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
