Faithful in Little Things

Anchor

Faithfulness is not proven by the size of the assignment but by how we handle what has already been entrusted to us.

Primary Scriptures

- Mattityahu 25:14-30
- Zekaryahu 4:10
- Qolosiyim 3:23-24

Weekly Focus

This week we are focusing on faithfulness in the small things.

Many people desire more while neglecting what they already have. Yet Scripture shows that YAHUAH often tests faithfulness through ordinary responsibilities before entrusting greater ones.

Before asking for more, examine how you are stewarding what has already been placed in your hands.

Reflection Questions

1. What responsibilities has YAHUAH currently entrusted to me?

2. Am I faithful in the small things that others may never notice?

3. Where do I need greater faithfulness and consistency?

Stewarding Time

Anchor

Time is one of YAHUAH's greatest gifts. Once spent, it cannot be recovered. Faithful stewardship requires using it wisely and intentionally.

Primary Scriptures

- Tehillim 90:12
- Ephesiyim 5:15-16
- Qoheleth 3:1
- Mishlei 6:6-11

Weekly Focus

This week we are focusing on stewardship of time.

Many people say they do not have enough time, yet Scripture teaches us to use our days wisely. Time cannot be stored or recovered.

Examine whether your time reflects your priorities and your commitment to YAHUAH.

2. Does my schedule reflect my priorities?

3. What activities consume time without producing value or growth?

Stewarding the Mind

Anchor

What occupies the mind eventually shapes our decisions, attitudes, and actions. Faithful stewardship requires guarding our thoughts and bringing them into obedience to the Word.

Primary Scriptures

- Romiyim 12:2
- Qorintiyim Bet 10:5
- Pilippiyim 4:8
- Mishlei 4:23

Weekly Focus

This week we are focusing on stewardship of the mind.

The battle for obedience often begins in our thoughts. Scripture teaches us to guard our minds, reject destructive thinking, and focus on what is true and upright.

Examine whether your thoughts are being shaped by the Word or by the influences around you.

Reflection Questions

1. What thoughts occupy my mind most often?

2. Are my thoughts drawing me closer to YAHUAH or pulling me away?

3. Which thoughts consistently compete with the Word in my life?

WEEK 4

STEWARDED THE TONGUE

Using words in ways that honor YAHUAH.

The tongue reveals what fills the heart.

Stewarding the Tongue

Anchor

Words have the power to build up or tear down. Faithful stewardship requires speaking with wisdom, truth, and self-control.

Primary Scriptures

- Ya'aqob 3:5-10
- Mishlei 18:21
- Ephesiyim 4:29
- Tehillim 141:3

Weekly Focus

This week we are focusing on stewardship of the tongue.

Scripture teaches that our words reveal what is in our hearts. Faithful stewardship includes speaking truthfully, wisely, and with self-control.

Examine whether your speech reflects the character and instructions of YAHUAH.

Reflection Questions

1. Do my words bring encouragement or unnecessary harm?

2. In what situations do I struggle most to control my speech?

3. What conversations or habits of speech need correction?

WEEK 5

Stewarding Resources

Anchor

Everything we possess ultimately belongs to YAHUAH. Faithful stewardship requires managing resources with wisdom, gratitude, and accountability.

Primary Scriptures

- Luqas 16:10-12
- Mishlei 3:9-10
- Mattityahu 25:14-30
- Qorintiyim Aleph 4:2

Weekly Focus

This week we are focusing on stewardship of resources.

Scripture teaches that what we have is not truly our own. Time, possessions, opportunities, and abilities have been entrusted to us by YAHUAH for a purpose.

Examine whether you are managing what YAHUAH has provided with faithfulness and gratitude.

Reflection Questions

1. How am I currently using the resources YAHUAH has entrusted to me?

2. Am I managing my possessions, opportunities, and responsibilities wisely?

3. Where do I need greater accountability in stewardship?

Stewarding Relationships

Anchor

Relationships are a stewardship from YAHUAH. Faithful stewardship requires treating others with wisdom, integrity, patience, and love according to Scripture.

Primary Scriptures

- Romiyim 12:18
- Qolosiyim 3:12-14
- Mishlei 27:17
- Galatiyim 6:2

Weekly Focus

This week we are focusing on stewardship of relationships.

Scripture teaches that relationships influence our growth, decisions, and walk. Faithful stewardship includes encouraging others, maintaining integrity, and pursuing peace whenever possible.

Examine whether your relationships reflect the character and instructions of YAHUAH.

Reflection Questions

1. Which relationships are helping me grow in obedience to YAHUAH?

2. Are there relationships that need healing, boundaries, or greater wisdom?

3. How can I better serve and encourage those YAHUAH has placed in my life?

Stewarding Your Assignment

Anchor

YAHUAH has entrusted each person with specific responsibilities, opportunities, and work to accomplish. Faithful stewardship requires remaining focused, diligent, and obedient to the assignment entrusted to us.

Primary Scriptures

- Qorintiyim Aleph 15:58
- Nechemyahu 6:3
- Timotiyahu Bet 4:7
- Qolosiyim 3:23-24

Weekly Focus

This week we are focusing on stewardship of our assignment.

Distractions, comparison, and discouragement can pull us away from the work YAHUAH has given us to do. Scripture teaches us to remain steadfast, focused, and committed.

Examine whether you are giving your attention to your assignment or to things that compete with it.

Reflection Questions

1. What responsibilities or assignments has YAHUAH currently placed before me?

2. What distractions most often pull me away from my assignment?

3. How can I become more focused and consistent in what YAHUAH has called me to do?

Anchor

Faithfulness is not measured by how much we begin, but by how faithfully we endure. YAHUAH calls us to remain steadfast, obedient, and committed until the end.

Primary Scriptures

- Ivrim 10:36
- Timotiyahu Bet 4:7-8
- Chazon Yahusha 2:10

Weekly Focus

This week we are focusing on finishing faithfully.

Scripture teaches that endurance is required to receive the promise. Faithfulness is demonstrated through consistent obedience over time, not temporary enthusiasm.

Examine whether you are remaining steadfast in the things YAHUAH has entrusted to you.

Reflection Questions

1. In what areas have I remained faithful throughout this study?

2. Where do I need greater endurance and consistency?

3. What changes will I continue after this study is complete?
