Tamar Berk - “The Restless Dreams Of Youth”



Mid-to-late 90s female musicians were badass, from Alanis to Kathleen Hanna, we quickly believed in the power of the female singer-songwriter. While this morphed into who we know nowadays, I still believe in that 90s voice, and Tamar Berk is bringing me back to it.

A veteran of Chicago's 90s indie scene, Berk returns in 2021 to bring us her first solo album *The Restless Dreams Of You*. The sugary indie rock surges from the first note of “Skipping The Cracks”, ripping through the two and a half minute song like a pro.

A self-described love letter to herself, Berk shines throughout the album. Her voice has that deep warmth quality to it that feels nostalgic of listening to Liz Phair and Alanis Morissette. “Socrates & Me” showcases those darker corners of her voice, leaving the guitar line to wail appropriately.
