Moving Forward

First of all, thank you, our ministry partners for your faithful support. Because of your faithfulness, we are off to a great start in 2024.

As many of you may already know, The Mendenhall Ministries has been in a rebuilding process for a number of years now. We

were well on our way in this process until we had two major setbacks. Like any rebuilding process, setbacks are expected. Rebuilding involves tearing into walls; replacing wires; and/or removing surface structure. Our rebuilding efforts were slowed by the challenges of Covid-19, which dramatically impacted the number of volunteer groups that came to assist us with projects. The number went from 19 to three. The second major challenge was the loss of our tax-exempt status. Consequently, we experienced a reduction in contributions. Working through the process of getting re-instated with IRS took a great deal of time, energy, and resources. But, praise God, we are re-instated!

Because of the impact of these challenges, we recently reduced staff pay. However, our teachers and staff continue to be committed to the work of the ministry in spite of this reduction. I am thankful for their tenacity to hang in the fight.

During this challenging time we began to think outside the box. As I informed you last year, we are developing an initiative to bring clean energy to our area.

When in operation, Son Solar, Inc., as it is called, will reduce the energy cost of 100 households; provide technical jobs and technical training; and educate families about sustainable energy.

MBC Lunches New Outreach: Son Solar, Inc.

During the Covid-19 lock down, we all watched a lot of YouTube. We came across several videos on solar farms and got the idea of starting a demonstration solar farm on the church's 120-acre farm. The Lord blessed us to connect with a retired born-again believer in South Carolina, Stephen Shelton, who agreed to help us. With the availability of federal funding for alternative energy community projects, Mendenhall Bible Church, (MBC), incorporated Son Solar, Inc. to move our ideas forward.

A working group has been meeting weekly since October 2022, and has submitted several applications for funding. We were blessed to receive a planning grant for two different projects: the solar farm project, which is now an agri-solar farm project with Alcorn State University assisting with the agriculture part; and a community solar project where we plan to install solar panels on MBC,GOCS, Nazareth Day Care Center, and New Horizon International Church in Jackson. These are planning grant so we can develop solid proposals to present to foundations for funding,. We are trusting God for the approximate \$5 million we need to bring the community solar project into reality and the additional needed for the agri-solar farm (Continued on page 2).

GENESIS ONE CHRISTIAN SCHOOL

My journey at Genesis One began in 1987. While serving as a classroom teacher and later as the assistant principal, until 2000, I fell in love with the students and the school. In 2021, I returned to serve as principal. My return was a *calling* and an act of love.

The staff of eight and I work diligently to provide a quality education while modeling and

promoting Christian values currently to 43 precious students, ranging from three through 12 years of age. With additional staff we could accommodate more students.

This year has been particularly challenging. The staff, who were already underpaid, experienced a 20% pay cut. This hardship, however, has not prevented them from giving *more than* 100% each day. I am touched by their dedication. God has blessed Genesis One with people who love Him and who have a heart for His children. Because of the quality of instructions, and our caring and safe environment, our students perform very well academically <u>and</u> we have a waiting list of potential students.

Even though this year had its financial challenges, I am

not discouraged. In fact, I am encouraged by the steadfastness of my staff and by the faithfulness of you, our ministry partners. Thank you for demonstrating agape love toward the students through your student sponsorship, by giving to the general fund, or as a volunteer who helped give the school facility a face lift.

Plans for the 2024-2025 academic year are very ambitious. They include increasing the school's enrollment to 60 students and adding 3 teachers and a coach to the staff. GOCS is strong in the areas of science, mathematics and language. Students are excelling in STEM. We will continue to build on this. However to offer a more balanced program, I plan to incorporate more extracurricular activities with a greater focus on art and more physical education activities such as basketball and volleyball.

Transportation is an issue for us. Prayerfully, we will be blessed with a Genesis One school bus to transport our students to field trips and various competitions.

Through much prayer and dedication of our staff, Genesis One Christian School will continue to impact the lives of our students, their parents, and our community. I solicit your prayers and continued financial support as we continue to do the work God has entrusted to us.

With both projects we have written in a workforce development component. We are working with our local junior college, Copiah-Lincoln Community College, to develop a curriculum that would lead to certifications for graduates in solar technology.

We also will co-sponsor with TMM this year's summer youth program to introduce elementary and high school students to solar and other alternative energy concepts and careers.

Although Son Solar, Inc. is a separately incorporated, 501(c) 3 tax exempt organization, it has the same board members as those who serve on TMM's board and Dr. Holloway is the president. Please keep us in your prayers to secure the necessary personnel and funding to bring these projects to fruition.
