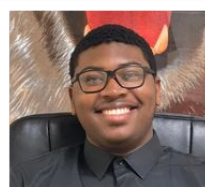

Rent Assistance for Harper Village Residents

In collaboration with Mississippi Housing Partnership, (MHP), TMM was able to assist several residents of Harper Village with their rent. This assistance is made possible through a grant, administered by MHP from Rental Assistance Mississippi Program (RAMP), a federal initiative to assist households whose ability to pay rent and/or utilities was impacted by COVID-19.

On February 18th, applications were reviewed. So far, nine residents have received assistance and two are under review.

We are grateful for the partnership with Mississippi Housing Partnership. Residents who were struggling with rent payment were able to catch up.

It is our aim to continue to collaborate with MHP and other agencies in the state to enhance the quality of life of the residence of Harper Village and the wider community.

Learning is FUN: STEM/SUMO Robotics Competition



The 7th Annual STEM/SUMO Robotics Competition was held in Flowood, MS on March 12, 2022. This competition is sponsored annually by Mississippi Robotics, a non-profit organization involved in training youth and teachers in science, technology, math and engineering through practical hands-on activities. The competition is designed to exercise and measure students' abilities in several areas involving skills, critical thinking, and strategy.

Nine 3rd–5th grade students from Genesis One Christian School (GOCS), participated. They performed exceptionally well.

Three of GOCS students were interviewed by one of the local TV reporters. The students were confident and poised. All three interviews were broadcasted on the evening news.

One hundred sixty-four students ranging from 3rd grade through 12th grade, representing 16 schools participated in the competition. Overall, Genesis One Christian School ranked first in the 3rd through 5th grade competitions. The students competed in the following categories: Math, Science, Tool ID, and Electricity.

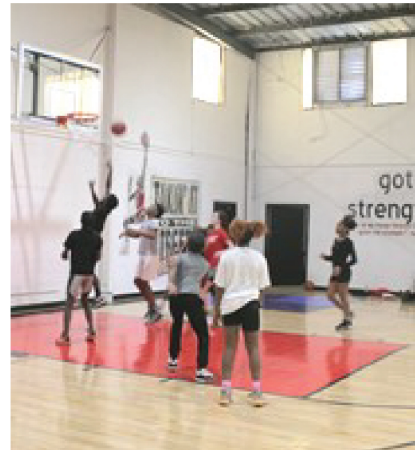

He has developed a program that allows

for free play and organized basketball with structured exercise and training/practice for both genders and all ages. One of the objectives is to develop an outstanding TMM basketball team for each age group. Secondly, to facilitate the development of other teams in surrounding communities to participate in competitions. Six teams from four counties have already registered for the Spring Men's League.

The exercise room is also shaping up. Two Total Gyms were donated by Mr. R.A. Buckley's granddaughter, Deloris Hughes.

We are anticipating a summer full of activities and fun in the Gym. The beautiful state-of-the-art flooring and air-conditioning make it a very inviting place to spend hours of (supervised) time. The Gym has always been a safe place for neighborhood kids to meet and play. It has also served and will continue to serve as a facility to reach young people with the Good News of Jesus Christ.

VOLUNTEER HIGHLIGHTS

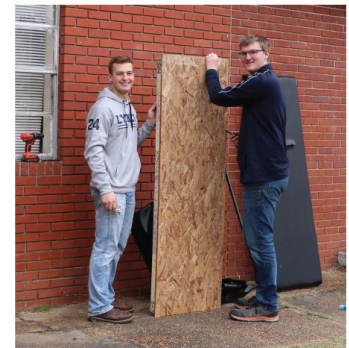
Dordt University (Sioux City, IA), Students Spend Spring Break in Mendenhall

Seven undergraduate students from Dordt University (IA), exchanged a week of fun and relaxation for a week of hard work and service in Mendenhall. And what a blessing they were! Below are some of the tasks they performed:

- Painted & organized classroom at GOCS
- Provided technical assistance with computer at GOCS
- Assisted with students in classrooms
- Organized equipment & supplies in two buildings
- Pressure washed two buildings
- Reupholstered 12 gym backboards
- Built book cases
- Dug 110 feet of trench for water pipes
- Weeded flower beds



One student said this about her experience: "My experience taught me what it looks like to serve God and others with whole hearts. Dr. Holloway models whole-hearted serving and encouraged me to love others in a sacrificial way. I am thankful for those who spoke to our group. Those conversations made me aware of struggles others have, especially in the African-American community. This experience is teaching me to recognize and counteract injustice in a new way. My biggest takeaway is that the Lord is good. His work in Mendenhall is evident, and it is encouraging to see how He is using The Mendenhall Ministries to bring hope to the community and glory to Himself."

Since meeting Dolphus Weary in the 1970s, we have been privileged to know and serve The Mendenhall Ministries. We've visited many times, served with our professional video production skills, and interacted with leaders, volunteers, and members of the community. It always amazes us to meet such hardworking volunteers from far-away places, and nearby, and to see Jesus' love for others in their hearts.

Together, we produced several videos for TMM. "On God's Side of the Tracks" is our favorite. We enjoyed capturing the changes and challenges in people's lives. Using the artificial division of railroad tracks in a Southern town, we showed God mightily at work on the "side of the tracks" that some folks might discount or be unaware of.

Gary served on the Board of Directors and is also an associate member of Mendenhall Bible Church. He gained insight into socio-economic situations of rural Mississippi, issues in small towns, and increasing united cooperation between black and white believers in Christ. Susan edited the Youth Development Manual for Voice of Hope in Dallas. Intentional teaching and modeling are vital for youth to build effective, satisfying lives that bless others. Since the 1960s-70s, we praise God for progress made, but more is needed.

Mississippi is woven into our hearts! Though we're Texans, we met at Belhaven College (now University) and lived as newlyweds in Jackson. It was a joy to meet with Dr. Scottye Holloway last Fall in Dallas, and again with him and Evelyn Njoroge when we visited TMM in March.

In 2009, our local Bible church commissioned us as business-and-video missionaries. Since we teach Biblical Financial Principles, Business Ethics, and Video Production Skills --with passion to train future leaders--Dr. Holloway invited us to TMM to teach a week in the Summer Enrichment/Youth Leadership Development Program. We look forward to that cooperation!
