Our very own, Duriel Jammal Banks, was hired as assistant principal of MHS beginning this school term, 2021/22.


Mr. Banks has a long history with TMM. In his own words:

- Plans are underway to integrate STEM/Robotics into GOCS 2021/22 curriculum.
