

- Operation London Bridge— September 2022
















UK National Resilience Framework

 Shared understanding of the civil contingencies risks we face;


 Prevention rather than cure wherever possible; and

Surrey's Key Risks




- Wildfire



- Develop a Community Emergency and Resilience Plan








Developing a Community Emergency and Resilience Plan
