SGT AT ARMS LINES - Paul Ferrigno

I've just recently learned of an organization named POPPA (Police Organization Providing Peer Assistance) and thought perhaps it might be of interest to our membership, some of whom, like myself, had no idea of its existence.

Originally founded in 1996 for active officers, POPPA provides peer support for New York City police officers experiencing personal or professional problems, such as trauma, stress, depression, alcohol abuse, or family problems. The POPPA Organization is an independent, not-for-profit agency, offering entirely confidential services through trained volunteers from the NYPD.

In April 2006, following a year of planning, volunteer recruitment, and training, POPPA launched its retiree program designed along the lines of POPPA's Helpline for active officers. It operates a helpline for Retirees 24 hours a day/7 days a week. It is a free and confidential program which helps individuals cope with a wide range of personal issues, including depression, anxiety, family situations, alcohol and pain medication abuse, and even suicidal thoughts or intentions. Retirees can call and speak to another retiree and if needed receive a referral to mental health professional.

POPPA has peer volunteer in many states including NY, MD, VA, SC, NC, GA, FL, CA, NV, AZ, NE. The program offers confidential, peer-based support free of charge for callers to 800.599.1085. POPPA considers the extension of its support to retired cops as a moral imperative.

Volunteer retirees are trained as PSOs to answer the 24-hour Retiree Help-Line covering the New York Metropolitan area and other states throughout the country. The state of Florida has 25 Peers trained to assist retirees that call the line. Using skills in listening without judging and in maintaining strict confidentiality, PSOs talk with Helpline callers, meet with them if requested, and assist

them, as appropriate, in finding professional help. Like active officers, retired officers experience a wide range of stress-related conditions. Alcohol and substance abuse, family problems, and depression are among the most common problems reported. About one-third of police officers involved in a traumatic incident suffer significant post-traumatic stress disorder. Untreated PTSD can be debilitating long after retirement. In addition to conditions shared with active officers, retirees may suffer from physical problems related to injuries or aging or from stress arising from the loss of police duties and colleagues.

If you know of any active or retired officer that may possibly be in need of these services, I urge you to inform them of the above. On a lighter note, last year we had a great turnout at our annual golf outing. Hopefully, we can do the same this year. Come out and have fun. As always, plenty of food and beer as well as soft drinks. You won't regret it.

The first recorded Police Officer line of duty death was in 1971. As of July 20, 2016, 20,789 names have been engraved on the wall. A Police Museum is under construction on the site of the wall. It is being built with donations from ordinary people throughout the United States as well as Police Officers. The Museum is expected to open in late 2018. It will tell the story, "our story", of law enforcement through high tech, interactive exhibitions, historical artifacts and extensive educational programming. The Museum is ours. 



N.Y.S. ENHANCED STAR PROGRAM

- 1. There is an Enhanced Star Program if you are 56 years old.
- 2. You should be getting a refund check for your property taxes this fall. The amount depends on your income.
- 3. Seniors should file for income verification at their assessor's office.
- 4. You have to apply each year to verify your income to apply for exemptions to reduce your property tax.
- All applications for exemptions must be filed before March 1st.
- 6. You can take multiple exemptions.

WARNING New cameras have been installed on every city bus. 





APPLICATION

The application is available in this newsletter (see below) or may be obtained online www.vz1013.com or by contacting our office (347) 216 5215. It must be completed on the provided application form (see below) or it can be duplicated. Nonconforming applications will be discarded.

SPONSOR
Applicants must be sponsored by a member of the NYCPD Verrazano 10-13 Association in good standing for the past three (3) consecutive years. A Sponsor may submit multiple applications for different children. However, a sponsor is limited to only one scholarship award selection every three (3) consecutive yearly drawings.

A son, daughter or grandchild of a member is eligible for a scholarship and must be attending or enrolled in a College or University on a full-time basis (taking at least 12 credits) for the 2017 school year. Each child can only win once, but a member can sponsor another child after waiting three (3) years. High School students must be attending a tuition-paying school.

ONLY ONE ENTRY PER APPLICANT

Only one application per applicant is permitted. If more than one application is received for the same applicant, all but one application for that applicant will be discarded.

VERIFICATION OF ATTENDANCE

Applicants must be attending the education facility during the application year. Proof of enrollment must accompany the application.

NUMBER OF SCHOALRSHIPS AWARDED

For the 2017 school year, three (3) College scholarships and one (1) High School scholarship will be awarded in the amount of \$500.00 each.

SCHOLARSHIP DRAWINGS

Drawings will be on a lottery basis in order to give each applicant an equal chance for selection. Scholarship awards will be drawn by the Scholarship Committee at the NYCPD Verrazano 10-13 Association holiday meeting in December. They will be drawn in full view of the members present (Alternate drawing date is the January general meeting). All applications must be received prior to the drawing date. NO APPLICATIONS WILL BE ACCEPTED ON THE DAY OF THE DRAWING.

The DEA gets many inquiries from our members about DEA cards and other items (shield cases, etc.) being sold on ebay, Craigslist, or elsewhere on the Internet. This is an issue the union has been aware of and has been working on for many years.

It is deeply offensive to the membership to see DEA cards for sale on various websites on the Internet. If you see sales of our cards online, please contact DEA Headquarters Trustee Patrick Donohue at <a href="mailto:persistence-patrick-p

Each DEA card carries the disclaimer/information, "This card is the property of the NYC DEA. It may not be sold or duplicated, except by the NYC DEA. This card may be confiscated by any law enforcement officer."

Please be advised that the DEA can also have an item removed from ebay if a vendor is violating our trademarked name, logo, and motto by manufacturing and selling an unauthorized item that the DEA does not create, but which carries our name, logo, initials, or our "Greatest Detectives in the World" motto. In those instances, the DEA can use the ebay "VERO" (copyright verification) program and file a report with the website stating the item for sale is in violation of our trademarks. We have been successful in removing items for sale (fake parking placards, etc. for instance) that violate our trademark holdings.

In addition, authentic police gear (such as full-sized NYPD shields, NYPD flak jackets, etc.) may also not be sold on ebay.

If you see a DEA item for sale on ebay, Craigslist, or another Internet site and the item appears to be fake or counterfeit, please email the link to Patrick Donohue at patrickdonohue@nycdetectives.org ... and Sam Katz at samkatz@nycdetectives.org ... and the union will investigate the situation.

DEA members, both active and retired, are advised to exercise discretion regarding to whom they gift DEA cards. Commemorative cards should not be dispensed to individuals of questionable character as it could result in a negative reflection on our membership and on our union.

- Other exclusions may apply that are not listed above.



What Commissioner Peters ignores is that the "substantiated" (meaning "unproven") allegations upon which he makes his threat are subject to review by other agencies, including the newly-formed Administrative Prosecution Unit of CCRB. Of the ten substantiated cases out of 1022 complaints to CCRB (thus, 1012 were not "substantiated") which constitute the universe (his word) of cases reviewed, APU has taken one "chokehold" case to trial – and lost. One other chokehold case was dismissed by APU, and one is pending. The remaining six were administratively adjudicated by the Department, with administrative penalties being meted out by Commissioner Raymond Kelly, who earned a well-deserved reputation among the rank and file as an extremely tough disciplinarian.


CCRB does not distinguish "chokeholds" – thus, CCRB has substantiated chokehold cases where the officer involved was not even aware that, in the course of wrestling a violent felon into custody, he momentarily restricted the breathing of the suspect during a minutes-long arrest process. Indeed, CCRB "substantiates" chokehold cases where the "choke" was incidental, accidental, unintentional or even unknown to the officer involved. These are the factors considered by the Department when determining punishment to its members – not the simple reliance upon the inflammatory and often misused term "chokehold".

Finally, we note that a prerequisite to arresting officers for the use of a chokehold is a Penal Code that criminalizes it. There is none, nor should there be, insofar as there are already numerous laws on the books – both State and Federal – that criminalize the use of intentional excessive force by police officers.

We suggest that Commissioner Peters reconsider his unwarranted threat. The image of yet another cowboy riding down Main Street shouting "I'm the new law in Town" does nothing to further the serious discussion needed to mend the fabric of the City.

A Convention may open up New York's Constitution to hastily thought out changes and reversal of laws and protections that in some cases took more than 200 years to put into effect; and for police, firefighters, paramedics, Corrections, sanitation workers, teachers, MTA, hospitals, etc, benefits that took decades to achieve. 


