PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



Summer has passed and we are well into the Fall season. Baseball is over, football and hockey are in and we've experienced our first snowfall. I hope that all of our members and their families had a safe and wonderful summer. Many things have taken place and you will be updated on the happenings of the organization. The first item I would like to address, and hopefully clarify some of its issues is the bantering that has gone on concerning unity with the other 10-13 organization. To be more specific, the 10-13 Clubs of America. I have stayed in the background on this matter and now feel it is time that I offer not only my knowledge of the situation (past discussions on unity), but to also give my opinion on certain matters. When the recent emails between clubs from both organizations started it did not come about because of any offering by the 10-13 Clubs of America. It started because clubs in both organizations were disgusted with the fact that two of our clubs were being threatened with a lawsuit over the use of the "10-13" symbol. We had a new chapter being formed in Pennsylvania and they were told that the could not use the 10-13" logo because it had been copyrighted by the 10-13 Clubs of America. They were also told, or to be blunt, being coerced, to believe that this could be rectified if they were to join that organization. Our other chapter being threatened was from Raleigh, North Carolina who had belonged to the other 10-13 and left them to join ours. So with this started all the discussions on unity between clubs belonging to both organizations. Could these discussions have gotten off on more of a wrong foot, than that of one retiree organization threatening to sue another organization of retired Police Officers over the use of a term that has so much meaning to it. A term which they, the 10-13 Clubs of America did not invent. A term that carried so much history with it, as it was our lifeline, our CALL FOR HELP when we were in trouble. I tell you this, the other organization has put a new meaning to signal code 10-13, and it's not one of helping other officers. I know each of us have experienced an awful lot during our careers, but to have other retiree's threatening to sue us over this for the sake of trying to increase their membership is an atrocity. So now we have clubs from each organization talking unity, that's ok with me...but when you speak of this you must be aware of the efforts that took place in the past for the sake of unity. Some years ago, Gene Loewy and Richie Carroll were invited to our National Convention for the

purpose of discussing unity between both 10-13's. This invitation was made by our National President Anthony "Tony" Perrone with the intent of something positive come out of it, which could have possibly unified both groups. Tony had put together a committee headed by Harry Morse for the purpose of presenting a unity plan to Loewy and Carroll. On the day of our executive meeting Tony had asked Loewy and Carroll to please wait in our hospitality room until he had conducted our opening business and handled a few brief matters. I personally escorted Loewy and Carroll to the hospitality room where they met several of our guest and were told to make themselves comfortable and help themselves to whatever they wanted. Within a half hour they were escorted back to our meeting room in order to discuss the issue of unity. In short what transpired was this...Tony Perrone and Harry opened the discussions and laid out their suggestions. Tony had explained that the leadership should be based in the New York area since it would be easier to have leaders that was easily available to respond to legislative matters in both the City and Albany. This immediately met with opposition from both Loewy and Carroll. Their suggestion was that we dissolve the name NYCPD National 10-13 Association and for our clubs to fall under their banner. They further stated that they would be in charge and that Tony would be their legislative representative and report back to them. Tony made it a point to ask Carroll what could be possibly do while living in Florida. Their response was that Loewy lived in New York and they will run things together. Let me remind you that in all the years I've been going to Albany for Lobby Day, I have never seen Loewy there representing the 10-13 Clubs of America. The only banner he brings is his own club which reads "New York 10-13 Association". The banner which Tony so proudly displays reads "NYCPD National 10-13 Association Inc," Get the point, Tony represents all our clubs and their members. The last issue was that of finances so that each organization could show just how many members they had and what their dues intake and expenditures were. We furnished Carroll and Loewy with all our financial records for the last three years. When they were asked to do the same, their response was "this is not a merger between Home Depot and Lowes", and that they would not divulge their financial information. The meeting ended with Carroll and Loewy being adamant about their demands. Needless to say, we all knew UNITY was a dead issue. What transpired over the years was them saying that they were totally disrespected at our convention and we were against unity, which is a complete and total falsehood. It should be noted that this was not the first attempt at merging both groups. It had taken place many times over the years, with this being the latest undertaking. There you have it, from someone who has kept quiet all these years, I guess I was waiting for the right time to chime in. Well the right time came when they threatened to sue another police retiree group. Am I glad I didn't have to depend on these two when I called a 10-13!

On July 27-29 our National 10-13 held its annual convention at the Honors Haven Resort and Spa. The event was very well attended and was hosted by National President Tony Perrone. The hospitality room was well stocked with refreshments and snacks and remained open sun up to whenever. The weekend was capped off with a sit down dinner on Saturday night, where President Perrone Honored the outgoing 10-13 presidents. The highlight of the evening came when a scholarship in the name of the late National Treasurer was presented; Tom's wife Zena and her sons and their families were present. Tom was an original founder of the 10-13, a great friend and a good cop...he will be missed. Our vice president Bob Walsh, treasurer John McLoughlin, members Frank Martarella (along with his wife Vivian) and past VZ president Harry Morse were all in attendance.

On August 28, we held our annual golf outing at the Silver Lake Golf Course in Staten Island. It was attended by 102 golfers and had 46 hole sponsors making it our most successful ever. In addition we had over 25 businesses donate gift certificates to include in our dine around packages. A very special thanks goes to Frank Martarella and his wife Vivian who helped secured sponsors and donors even as

Vivian was recovering from knee replacement surgery. Finally a big shout out to our treasurer John McLoughlin who worked tirelessly keeping track of all our records for the event. A full list of sponsors and donors can be found inside the magazine.

Our September and October meetings were well attended as we welcomed back our members from their summer vacations. National President Anthony Perrone was our guest speaker at the October meeting where he discussed pending legislative matters and the aforementioned threat of a lawsuit by National 10-13 Clubs of America.

The guest speakers at the November meeting were retired Deputy Inspector James LaPiedra and Anthony Fauci of the Guided Professional Solutions Group. They gave an in-depth presentation on financial programs that I know was of interest to many. It was a great meeting. I would also like to thank Guided Professional Solutions for their \$250.00 donation to our Memorial Scholarship Fund.

On behalf of myself and the entire Board of Officers we wish each of our members and their families a very Merry Christmas, Happy Chanukah and a very Healthy and Happy New Year.

The NYCPD Verrazano 10-13 Memorial High School/College Scholarship 2011-2012

APPLICATIONS:

The application is available in this newsletter or may be obtained by contacting our office. It must be completed on provided application or an exact duplicate in size. Non-conforming applications will be discarded.

SPONSORSHIP:

Applicants must be sponsored by a member of the NYCPD Verrazano 10-13 Association in good standing for the past three (3) consecutive years.

ELIGIBILITY:

A son, daughter or grandchild of a member is eligible for a scholarship and must be attending or enrolled in a College or University on a full-time basis (taking at least 12 credits) for the 2012-2013 school year. Each child can only win once, but a member can sponser another child after waiting three (3) years. High School students must be attending a tuition-paying school.

ONE ENTRY PER APPLICANT:

Only one application per applicant is permitted. If more than one application is received for the same applicant, all applications for that applicant may be discarded.

VERIFICATION OF ATTENDANCE:

Winners will be required to verify school enrollment.

NUMBER OF SCHOALRSHIPS:

For the 2011-2012 school year, three (3) College scholarships and one (1) High School scholarship will be awarded in the amount of \$500.00 each.

SCHOLARSHIP DRAWINGS:

Drawings will be on a lottery basis in order to give each applicant an equal chance at selection. Scholarship awards will be drawn at the NYCPD Verrazano 10-13 Association general meeting on January 18, 2012, by the Scholarship Committee and viewed by the membership in attendance (Alternate drawing date is the February 15th meeting). All applications must be received prior to the drawing date. NO APPLICATIONS will be accepted at the meeting.
