PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



John A. Donohue

Two years ago the members of the NYC Verrazano 10-13 Association gave me the opportunity of representing them as President. A lot of water has flowed under the bridge since that November day in 2012. As President, I had to make decisions; some were welcomed warmly while others were not. However, believe this: Everything I did was not based upon my personal feeling but was done for the good and betterment of the Organization.

I can't say enough in this column about the dedication and work on your behalf by those members identified in the left hand column of this page. You gave me a Board to be proud of. Two years ago, I did not know most of them but we could not have functioned as an Organization without them. It was through the efforts of people like Sergeant-At Arms **Joseph Cammilleri** who never said an ill word about anyone and was able to keep our meetings on an even keel; Secretary, **Joseph Bonamo** who imparted much needed information to the members; Vice-President, **Richard Commesso**, who gave me the leadership guidance needed to make many of my decisions; and Treasurer, **Charles Manganato**, was the work horse of this Organization. He not only watched over every dollar but was the Organization's main record keeper. Most of you did not hear a lot from our Trustees: **Joseph Cammarata, Jack Hellman**, and **Joe Molloy** along with our Board Advisor **Anthony Franzese** but when I needed them they were also there.

Unknown to many, **Charlie Manganato** and **Jack Hellman** were my main confidents and my go to guys. In fact, I consider them my right and left hand. We would converse almost on a daily bases about the needs and direction of the Organization. I always knew that I would get a straight answer to my questions. If I wanted to know what was happening all you had to do was ask **Charlie** and if you needed anything, **Jack** did it. **Rich Commesso** was the glue that bound us all together.

Another thing most of you don't know about is the dedication of our Chaplain, **Pastor John Carlo** who always found the time to attend a Police Officer's funeral or give confidential advice when called upon. When information had to be disseminated to the members all I had to do was call upon **Thomas Zablocki** and/or **Edward Reuss.** When I needed a legal opinion,

John Friscia always came through. When volunteers were needed, I called upon the "Mall Walkers," John Feis, Joe Manfra, Al Polizio, Frank Polizzi along with the "Snow Birds," Don Vinci, and Ed Jordan." Lastly former Recording Secretary Ellen Bjorkstrom and Garv Glessing should be included in the mix.

When it came to our 501 (c) 3 status, I guarded it very closely. Through it we were able to solicit grants, get reductions on postage, and sales tax relief. Members who attended meetings found that this coupled with our austerity program allowed our senior members, those over 60, a meal reduction along with a free Holliday meal and those who reached their 80th birthday, with 5 years continuous membership, free membership (they are identified on page 6). It also allowed us to purchase shirts to identify our members as former Police Officers when they responded to an emergency situation, police rallies, and I'm sorry to say funerals on Staten Island.

Many in our Organization chastised me for causing 10-13 disunity with other 10-13's. My decision was based entirely upon our 501 (c) 3status and our inability to join a PAC (Political Action Committee) by City, State, and Federal regulations. FYI, I attempted to unify all the 10-13s around the country by calling for an informal exploratory meeting between myself and the presidents of the two largest 10-13 organization throughout the country. I had a proposal to put on the table what I believed would be palatable to all. The president of the larger organization agreed to the meeting and even offered his office space. The president of the other organization sent a response to my letter citing personal feelings and he chose to give a catharsis on his role and that of his organization. Thus the meeting never took place.

Since this will be my last Newsletter, I would like to thank all of you for the understanding and support you gave me these past two years and wish all health, happiness, and success in your future endeavors. I would also like to wish the new Board of Directors success (They are identified on pages 4 & 12).

Police Officers: John V. Nevins, Jr. (1928-2014). Jack joined the NYPD in 1952 and was assigned to multiple Brooklyn precincts. In 1966, he retired from the 78th Precinct as a Police Officer after serving 25 years and Ted Loschiavo, (1943-2014). Ted was appointed to NYPD in 1968 and was assigned to several Brooklyn Precincts. He then was assigned to BCI and finished his career in MISD. He retired in 1988 after 20 years of service. Detective William M. Frickenstein (1940-2014). Bill joined the New York Police Department in 1967 and was assigned to several Brooklyn precincts before being transferred to the Staten Island District Attorney's Squad. He rose to the rank of Detective and retired after 30 years of service. Sergeants Albert Zarr (1943-2014). Al joined the NYPD In 1967 and was promoted to the rank of Sergeant. He retired from the NYPD in 1985 and Peter J. Mc Polin (1961-2014), Peter joined the NYPD in 1984 and served as a patrolman in Manhattan before a transfer to the Staten Island Emergency Service Unit. He was promoted to Sergeant in 1989 and served in the 120th, 122nd and 123rd precincts. He was forced to retire in 1995 after suffering a line-of-duty injury while subduing a suspect in Bay Terrace

2014 LIFE MEMBERS



What is the purpose of this website?

The process for removing your name from lists supplied by the Consumer Credit Reporting Companies, Equifax, Experian, Innovis and TransUnion, to be used for firm (preapproved / prescreened) offers of credit or insurance. Your rights as a consumer under the Fair Credit Reporting Act (FCRA) include the right to "Opt-Out" for 5 years or permanently."

Under the Fair Credit Reporting Act (FCRA), the Consumer Credit Reporting Companies (Equifax, Experian, Innovis, and TransUnion) are permitted to include your name on lists used by creditors or insurers to make firm (preapproved / prescreened) offers of credit or insurance that are not initiated by you ("Firm Offers"). The FCRA also provides you the right to "Opt-Out", which prevents Consumer Credit Reporting Companies from providing your credit file information for Firm Offers.

Through this website, you may request to:

- Opt-Out from receiving Firm Offers for Five Years (electronically through this website).
- Opt-Out from receiving Firm Offers permanently (mail Permanent Opt-Out Election form available through this website).
- Opt-In and be eligible to receive Firm Offers. This option is for consumers who have previously completed an Opt-Out request (electronically through this website).

If you choose to Opt-Out, you will no longer be included in firm offer lists provided by these four consumer credit reporting companies. If you are not receiving firm offers because you have previously completed a request to Opt-Out, you can request to Opt-In. In doing so, you will soon be among the many consumers who can significantly benefit from having ready access to product information on credit and insurance products that may not be available to the general public.

Former Captain and now our Chaplain, Pastor John Carlo, spoke about his availability to our members in need.




