A LITTLE GUN HISTORY

- In 1929, the *Soviet Union* established gun control. From 1929 to 1953, about 20 million dissidents, unable to defend themselves, were rounded up and exterminated.
- In 1911 *Turkey* established gun control. From 1915 to 1917, 1.5 million Armenians, unable to defend themselves, were rounded up and exterminated.
- *Germany* established gun control in 1938 and from 1939 to 1945, a total 13million Jews and others who were unable to defend themselves were rounded up and exterminated.
- *China* established gun control in 1935. From 1948 to 1952, 20 million political dissidents, unable to defend themselves were rounded up and exterminated.
- *Guatemala* established gun control in 1964. From 1964 to 1981, 100,00 Mayan Indians, unable to defend themselves were rounded up and exterminated.
- *Uganda* established gun control in 1970. From 1971 to 1979, three hundred thousand Christians, unable to defend themselves were rounded up and exterminated.
- *Cambodia* established gun control in 1956. From 1975 to 1977, one million educated people, unable to defend themselves, were rounded up and executed.

New NYS gun laws will go in effect this week

(WBNG) -- New gun laws in New York State will go into effect Sept. 13 with the New York State Police now overseeing background checks for every firearms and ammunition purchase. One change consumers will see is each ammunition background check will cost \$2.50 while checks for firearms will cost \$9. These fees will help fund the new program. All potential buyers must receive a "proceed" response from the New York State Police in order for a purchase to be completed. In case of denial, the buyer has 30 days to appeal the decision. Now, New York State firearm dealers, Federal Firearms licensers and ammunition sellers can register online. Operation specialists are currently assisting with the registration process. Registered dealers can begin the registration when the law goes into effect. Copyright 2023 WBNG. All rights

In response to several queries, I contacted the office of the NYPD Police Relief Fund, INC to ascertain the benefits provided for our membership and all retired officers in the New York area. The following is their response for which I am totally grateful.

To: UNIFORMED MEMBERS OF THE SERVICE
Subject: BENEFIT PROGRAM, POLICE RELIEF FUND

- 1. The exclusive function of the Emergency Medical Squad is to ensure that the highest level of care is afforded to every active and retired uniformed members of the service at their time of need. Many medical related services can be obtained from the Emergency Medical Squad. This service encompasses both the availability of ambulance service as well as the loan of a myriad selection of medical equipment for as long as their condition dictates.
- 2. The following criteria must be met in order for this benefit to become available:
 - a. The requesting PATIENT must be either an active or retired uniformed member of the service, his or her spouse, unmarried dependent children, father, mother, father-in-law, mother-in-law, or a brother or sister of the member. Please note that brothers and sisters are covered only if they are residing with and are supported by the member.
 - b. The ambulance is available to transport non-ambulatory patients as directed by a competent medical authority (i.e. Physician, Physician Assistant, Nurse Practitioner, etc.) from his/her residence to a hospital(s) or medical facility; from hospital or medical facility to his/her home and also from one hospital or medical facility to another hospital or medical facility.
 - c. The ambulance can travel up to two hundred and fifty (250) miles outside the city limits. However, one point of the trip must be within the confines of the City of New York.

THE AMBULANCE CAN NOT BE USED TN THE FOLLOWING SITUATIONS:

- NO EMOTIONALLY DISTURBED PATIENTS without the prior approval of the Commanding Officer, Emergency Medical Squad.
- b. NO EMERGENCY MATERNITY CASES.
- c. NO TRANSFERS WITHOUT MEDICAL AUTHORITY AND PROPER DISCHARGE DOCUMENTS.
- d. NO KNOWN AIRBORNE COMMUNICABLE DISEASE TRANSFERS without the proper direction of a competent medical authority and the approval of the Commanding Officer, Emergency Medical Squad.
- NO INTENSIVE CARE UNIT TRANSFERS without a doctor, a hospital approved nurse or paramedic onboard the ambulance. This is due to the fact that we are not certified as an advanced life support ambulance.
- f. NO PATIENTS WITH OPEN OR OOOZING WOUNDS without the proper dressings as per the instructions of a competent medical authority.
- g. NO DOCTOR APPOINTMENTS.
- h. NO WHEELCHAIR TRANSPORTS OR AMBULETTE SERVICES, the Police Relief Fund Ambulance is a NYS Certified Ambulance and is not equipped to transport patients in a wheelchair, therefore patients able to be seated upright and/or transported in a wheelchair are ineligible for the service.

IT SHOULD BE FURTHER NOTED THAT FOR THE PROTECTION OF ALL PATIENTS AND THE TRANSPORTING OFFICERS, ALL PRUDENT AND NECESSARY SAFETY STANDARDS AND MEDICAL PRECAUTIONS AS DIRECTED BY NYSDOH AND REGIONAL EMS PROTOCOLS SHALL BE STRICTLY FOLLOWED.

- 3. The ambulance service is available primarily Monday through Friday from 7:00 AM to 11:00 PM. It should be further noted that we are not a "first responder ambulance". The initial ambulance transportation to a medical facility should be handled directly through the patient's emergency ambulance number, whether that be "911" or another local emergency telephone number. As soon as the patient is stabilized at the initial receiving hospital, we will be glad to handle subsequent transfers. However, the patient must have an admitting physician as well as a room available at the receiving facility prior to transfer.
- 4. The following is a sample list of durable medical equipment currently stocked at our command and available to the membership and their families as <u>prescribed</u> by a competent medical authority (i.e. Physician, Physician Assistant, Nurse Practitioner, etc.):
 - oxygen therapy equipment
 - portable oxygen
 - oxygen concentrators
 - pulmo-aide equipment
 - fully adjustable electric hospital beds
 - wheel chairs, reclining wheel chairs
 - hip chairs
 - commodes, toilet seat extensions
 - canes, crutches
 - hoyer lifts and slings
 - trapeze bars
 - trapeze barstens unit therapy
 - geriatric chairs
 - intravenous stands
 - shower chairs, transfer benches

Additionally, other medical equipment comes available on occasion and members are advised to call this command with their specific and immediate medical need. If the medical equipment is currently available, the member will be advised, and arrangements will be made for pickup or delivery to the patient. If the patient lives within the confines of the City of New York, our command can make arrangements for the equipment to be delivered and professionally set up at the patient's residence. If the patient lives outside the City of New York, our staff will make necessary arrangements for a convenient time for the member to pick up the equipment at our facility.

- The entire benefit program described above is a cost-free benefit to all Uniformed Members of the Service and their covered family members. UMOS remain responsible for the serviceable return of all loaned durable medical equipment.
- 6. All requests for ambulance transportation and/or prescribed medical equipment is subject to availability, such requests should first be submitted to the patient's insurance provider. The Police Relief Fund and the Emergency Medical Squad will make every effort to accommodate the members request as covered by this benefit program. This benefit program is subject to change without notice.
- 7. UMOS should be prepared to provide the following information at the time of their request for service from the Emergency Medical Squad: patient's full name, address, phone number, date of birth, social security number, height, weight, current medical condition, prescription. In addition the requesting UMOS rank, full name, command, home address, phone number and relationship to the patient.
- 8. IF A MEMBER DIES - INFORMATION TO THE SURVIVING SPOUSE OR FAMILY (Hopefully Not Needed For A Long Time) Too often spouses and families are left in a quandary upon the death of a loved one. Few situations in life are more stressful than when a spouse passes. All too often we have a difficult time focusing on the issues at hand and need guidance to get the deceased affairs in order. The following is a general guide for the widow(er) or the decease's family regarding important notifications that must be made by the surviving spouse and information you should have on hand when a retiree dies.

I. PREPARATIONS BEFOREHAND

- GATHER ASSETS This doesn't mean piling them all together. It means getting a list of all the assets at the time of the decedent's death, along with copies of statements, deeds, etc. This information is needed for probate. It's also essential for filing federal and state estate tax returns, if required.
- REVIEW IRAs If the surviving spouse is the beneficiary, decide whether to roll an IRA over to the surviving spouse.
- GET GOOD ADVICE and get it now. The money you pay to attorneys and other advisers to resolve issues NOW can be much lower than if you deal with problems AFTER a person's death.
- In case of couples, usually most of the property is held in joint names and the survivor obtains same "by operation of law". However, there may be some items which were held in the name of the deceased only, and in that case it would be necessary to go to Probate Court to transfer ownership of that property, unless listed in a trust.
- GET ORGANIZED NOW When someone dies, one of the big problems for beneficiaries is locating the things necessary to settle the estate. Make sure you know before the death occurs where to find the following documents and information.

(This is just a partial list)

1. Living Will

2. Trust

3. Deeds (if any).

4. Safe-deposit boxes

(location of boxes, contents and keys)

5. Life insurance policies.

6. Funeral and burial instructions.

7. Names and addresses of creditors and debtors.

8. List of assets and where they are located.

9. List of all advisers (attorney, accountant, insurance agent, stockbroker, etc.).

II. STEPS TO BE TAKEN AFTER DEATH - Notifications to be made:

Contact the appropriate Union for a possible existing life insurance policy and for continuation of optional benefits, if qualified.

- 2. Contact the NYC Health Benefits Program for Special Continuation of Coverage application (coverage for life) located at 40 Rector Street, 3rd Floor, New York 10006 (212) 513-0470.
- 3. Contact the NYPD Operations Unit located at One Police Plaza at (646) 610-5580, for pall bearers (Funeral Director will usually do this for you) for all five boroughs, all of Long Island and Upstate New York, but not beyond Dutchess County.
- 4. Contact Social Security: (800) 772-1213 (Funeral Director will usually do this for you).
- 5. Contact Fraternal Organizations to arrange for visitors, Color Guard and possible insurance benefits.THIS AND THAT
- 6. If a veteran, notify the Veterans Administration at (800) 827-1000 for: Grave marker, Funeral Allowance and Flag (Funeral Director will usually do this for you). If can't find discharge papers or DD 214, you will need date of Enlistment, date of Discharge, Branch & Serial Number. If deceased had 100% disability for 10 years, spouse is entitled to an additional benefit.
- 7. Notify your Church or Temple for announcements. (Funeral Director will usually do this for you).
- 8. Health Insurance: COBRA (Consolidated Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1985) COBRA has a safety net. If spouse or dependent was covered under deceased's health plan they may continue coverage under COBRA for up to 36 months.

New York State in 2001 amended the Administrative Code to continue Health Care Coverage for Surviving Spouses for Life (Download Information Regarding this Amendment).

This enables the deceased's spouse and/or dependents to receive coverage at the group rate.

The City and the Line Organization health benefits stop at the death of the members.

The rate, though high, is cheaper than the non group rate.

THIS INFORMATION PERTAINS TO COBRA

Police Officers & Firefighter surviving spouses are to follow this procedure:

Attach a machine copy of the death certificate to a request for an application for COBRA FOR LIFE and send it to: Retired Employees Benefits Section, Att: Linda Harris (Cobra for Life), 40 Rector Street - 3rd Floor, New York, NY 10006

They will send the surviving spouse a pre-numbered application allowing the spouse to continue the health coverage the member had at a cost equal to 102% of what the City pays, which includes administrative fees. This is fairly reasonable. Applying for this must be done within 30 days. Benefits are retroactive if the surviving spouse requires medical attention during this interim period.

At this time if a member and spouse are of Medicare age, and reside in an area covered by Aetna, I would strongly recommend they choose that plan over GHI/EBC/CBP.

THINGS YOU WILL NEED

DEATH CERTIFICATES - Death Certificates are necessary in every step to the successful administration of a decedent's estate.

(Usually Funeral will obtain certificates as part of his service at current cost). They are usually needed for:

Pension Bureau

Veterans Administration (if a veteran)

Motor Vehicle Bureau if auto was in deceased's name. 1 for each insurance policy. Court (If probate is needed).

Your State Dept. of Revenue to obtain non-tax certificate if real property is involved. Bank accounts held in Trust for another 1 for each account if property held in a Trust. Personal Records.

Note: If estate is probated, some of the above will take a Letter Testamentary instead of a Death Certificate.

MARRIAGE CERTIFICATE (With Official Raised Seal):

Social Security, (not necessary if surviving spouse already receiving benefits) Veterans Administration, if a veteran.

LETTERS TESTAMENTARY or LETTERS OF ADMINISTRATION:

Motor Vehicle Bureau, if auto is in the deceased's name.

One for each bank account

Brokerage house account (share of stock or bonds, etc. that were in the deceased's name alone)

DISCHARGE PAPERS: DD 214 - (Original needed)

Social Security, if spouse was not already receiving benefits. Remember that service time counts toward qualification.

They will Photostat.

Veterans Administration, if a veteran

PAID FUNERAL BILLS: 1 copy for Pension Bureau, 1 copy for Probate Court, 1 copy for IRS, if taxable estate.

OTHER THINGS THAT MAY APPLY (usually after burial)

- Cancel any leases. (If your parent or loved one rented a home, cancel the lease after clearing out the furnishings) Inform insurance companies.
- File life insurance claims for any policies on the person's life, and request that the insurers send you Form 712, Life Insurance Statement (this is a statement about the life insurance that must be filed with the estate tax return).
- Make sure the car insurance company continues to cover the person's car until it's sold or transferred to a beneficiary.
- Make sure the homeowners policy continues to provide adequate coverage for the person's things until removed from the home.
- Notify companies the person did business with.
- Cancel credit cards, and close charge accounts.
- Have airlines to transfer frequent-flier miles to the primary beneficiary.

 (Each airline has different policy concerning this issue. Check with carrier about rules)

Consideration should also be given to making pre-death funeral arrangements. This provision, no matter how painful, should be discussed by couples and by parents with their families. Too often, spouse and children spend much too much money on a funeral and do so without really knowing what were the deceased's wishes in this regard (Place of burial, Cremation, etc.)

Consideration should also be given to having a "Family Durable Power of Attorney" (Someone to take over your finances if you become incapacitated or incompetent)

There are no words of comfort at such a difficult time, however, if you have all the necessary information at the ready it will expedite any claim that is pending, make the process run smoothly, and your stress level can be minimized.

69 CANCERS AND MANY RESPIRATORY ILLNESSES

HAVE BEEN LINKED TO 9/11 TOXINS.

Anyone who participated in the rescue and recovery operations in Lower Manhattan on 9/11, or during any part of the 8 months that followed, may be eligible for free health care and significant compensation.

The most common 9/11 illnesses for first responders include respiratory conditions, skin cancers, prostate cancer, blood cancers, thyroid cancer, breast cancer, lung cancer, and kidney cancer.



Hope all is well with you and your family. During the last couple of months, we have all been fighting to keep our NYC Health Benefits from being changed. I would like to thank everyone who participated in our efforts with the City Council to stop the change to the Administrative Code. When the Speaker of the Council spoke at the hearing, she mentioned that she received over 100,000 emails from retirees requesting that the City Council not change the code.

Through the Summer and Fall we have been working on forming a Legislative Information Network (LIN) with many other organizations. The network is up and running and continues to grow. The LIN was utilized for the City Council effort, and we thank those organizations for their participation in stopping the change being sought by the MLC. I should also mention the work being done by the NYC Organization of Public Service Retirees on our health protection and the great job they have been doing.

The effort by the City and the MLC is not over and since we are into the NY State Legislative Session, we are mo:ving foiward with our health protection legislation. As we all know, the attempt by the City and the MLC would affect all civil service retirees. There are two health protection bills that are numbered for this session. One bill, sponsored by Senator Lanza (S4191), and Assemblyman Weprin (A4989) would protect all retirees in New York State. We are putting our efforts into moving this bill forward, and working with the Alliance to get this bill a dedicated effective date. Once the actions are planned I will reach out to you through your club president. Expect that soon.

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



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
