

## CLUB HISTORY

**Eton Wick FC** was formed in 1881 and has played at Eton Wick Recreation Ground since 1904. The club has competed across numerous leagues, enjoying league and cup success including titles in the Windsor, Slough & District League, Chiltonian League, Hellenic League, and East Berkshire Football League. Following periods of change and rebuilding, the club continues to compete proudly within the local football pyramid.

**Old Windsor FC** was founded in 1898 and has been at the heart of village football ever since. Affiliated with the Berks & Bucks FA, the club has enjoyed sustained success in the East Berkshire Football League, including multiple league and cup honours and a historic treble in 2023/24. In 2025/26, the club entered three senior teams for the first time, continuing a strong pathway from youth football through to the adult game.

“This event is a fantastic opportunity for Eton Wick to showcase the team, the club and our players in front of friends, family and the wider football community. It’s a chance to show how far we’ve come over the last couple of years and highlight the progress the squad has made together.

For the players, matches like this are a great experience. Playing on a bigger stage in front of a good crowd allows them to demonstrate their ability and enjoy the occasion. Hopefully it gives them confidence to continue improving and play at the highest level they can in the future.

Our preparation hasn’t changed too much. We train with high intensity every week and approach each game the same way. Aside from the larger crowd, it’s about sticking to how we play and making sure we perform to the standards we set ourselves.

Events like this are important for grassroots football. They give the community a chance to see how competitive and enjoyable local football can be, and hopefully inspire younger players to get involved and one day represent a club like Eton Wick.”

“This event is all about the experience. With no real pressure on us, the lads get the chance to play at a fantastic venue and enjoy the occasion.

It’s a great opportunity, especially for our younger players, to showcase their talent and gain experience they can draw on in the future. Preparation hasn’t changed — from our point of view it’s business as usual, despite the step up in venue.

We’re a new team to adult football and the players have come a long way this season. This is another important step in their development, and I want them to enjoy themselves and show how good they are.

For Old Windsor, this event is really special. Seeing players progress from the Tigers youth side (Old Windsor Tigers) to representing the club on this stage highlights the pathway we’re building from youth to adult football.”

## Jason Hurley – Eton Wick FC

Jason Hurley began his football journey in Ireland at the age of six with his childhood club, Lakewood FC, inspired by watching his older brothers play. He later stepped into senior football with Tramore Senior FC, finishing as the club's top goalscorer, before returning to Lakewood where he scored the winning goal to take the club to its first ever cup final.

A move to England for work saw Jason continue his career with Westfield FC in the South Central League, followed by spells with Metropolitan Police and Sheerwater FC, where he added another league title.

After returning to Ireland and winning further silverware, Jason eventually moved back to England and found a home at Eton Wick FC. Operating as a central attacking midfielder, he is known for his relentless work rate, strong aerial ability and high-energy performances across the pitch.

A natural leader, Jason constantly organises and encourages his teammates, bringing a winning mentality and intensity to every match. With multiple league titles already to his name, he now hopes to help Eton Wick continue their proud history of success and add further silverware to the club's trophy cabinet.

## CLUB HISTORY

**Mortimer FC** was founded in 1934 as Mortimer Garth FC, originating from the Garth Club established in 1915. The club merged with Mortimer Men's Club in the early 1970s to form the modern side. Mortimer enjoyed success in the Reading League during the 1980s and 90s and now competes in the Hellenic League, continuing to develop youth football within the community.

**Bracknell Aces** were founded in 2024 and have competed in the East Berkshire Football League since their formation. The club's badge features the Lancaster Rose, representing its ownership. In their debut season, the Aces impressed by finishing 7th in the league, narrowly missing out on the promotion places.
