

## **SOCIETY RULES**

- The title is STAPLEHURST HORTICULTURAL SOCIETY.
- 2. The objectives are to further interest in horticulture, provide a programme of informative talks on related subjects and encourage members' and non-members' participation in shows.
- 3. An Annual General Meeting (AGM) will take place in December. Elections will be held for:
  - a) The Executive Officers of:- Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Secretary and Treasurer.
  - b) Up to nine additional non-executive members. (Nominations for these posts must be received by the Secretary by the November meeting).
  - c) The Executive Officers may co-opt additional committee members if there are vacancies.
- Annual membership and visitors' fees will be agreed at the AGM and become due in January for the calendar year. Children under 16 have free membership.
- The Chairman's Report and Financial Accounts to the 31<sup>st</sup> October will be presented at the AGM.
- Meetings will be held on the third Tuesday of each month at 8pm with the exception of the AGM.
- 7. The committee may appoint a President and invite members to become Vice Presidents or Life Members.
- 8. The Executive Officers may act in an emergency, the Chairman having a casting vote.
- 9. A decision to 'wind up' the society may only be taken by a majority of the members attending an AGM or an extra-ordinary AGM called for that purpose for which at least two calendar months' notice has been given. Members present will determine the distribution of the Society's assets.



# Maltesers Rocky Road Bars

#### **Ingredients**

175 g pouch of Maltesers
250g dark chocolate (70% cocoa solids) broken into pieces
50g butter
8 digestive biscuits
60g baby marshmallows
icing sugar to dust

#### <u>Method</u>

Line a 200mm/8" square tin with parchment paper.

Melt the chocolate with the butter in a bowl over boiling water until completely melted.

Remove from the heat. Set aside for at least 10 minutes whilst you get the rest of the ingredients ready. It's important that the chocolate isn't too hot when it is combined with the other ingredients, or it could melt the Maltesers and marshmallows and take the 'Rocky' out of this recipe. Bash the biscuits in a plastic bag until you have a mixture of chunks and powder.

Fold the crushed biscuits, marshmallows and Maltesers into the mixture with a spoon until all are coated in chocolate.

Pour into the tin and refrigerate for at least 30 minutes.

Sieve over a generous dusting of icing sugar.

Cut into slices for serving.

# Victoria Sponge

#### <u>Ingredients</u>

225g/8oz butter at room temperature, plus a little extra to grease tins 225g/8oz caster sugar

4 large eggs

2 tsp baking powder

225g/8oz self-raising flour

Strawberry or raspberry jam

#### <u>Method</u>

Preheat oven to 180C /Fan 160C/Gas 4

Grease and line two 20cm/8in sandwich tins.

Break eggs into large mixing bowl, add sugar, flour, baking powder and butter.

Mix together until well combined with an electric hand mixer.

Divide the mixture between the two greased cake tins lined with baking paper.

Bake the cakes on middle shelf for 25 minutes, checking them after 20 minutes.

The cakes are done when golden brown and coming away from the edge of the tins.

Press them gently to check – they should be springy to the touch. Set aside to cool in their tins for 5 min. Run a palette knife round the inside and turn out onto a cooling rack.

Sandwich together with strawberry or raspberry jam and dust with caster sugar.
