
# Habitat Happenings

### For row crop farms

The Indiana State Department of Agriculture has reopened its soil sampling program. Fields that have not been sampled in the last 3-4 years are eligible for free soil analysis and fertility program recommendations based on yield goals. More information and applications are **AVAILABLE HERE**
