Fox Sedge	<i>Carex vulpinoidea</i>
Dudley's Rush	<i>Juncus dudleyi</i>
<b>June Grass</b>	<b><i>Koeleria cristata</i></b>
Switchgrass <sup>1</sup>	<i>Panicum virgatum</i>
Little Bluestem <sup>2</sup>	<i>Schizachyrium scoparium</i>
<b>Prairie Dropseed</b>	<b><i>Sporobolus heterolepis</i></b>

1. Switchgrass can spread through rhizomes. It is included on this list because it is a good native alternative to invasive plants like Chinese Silvergrass.
2. Little bluestem can spread and may require additional effort to keep it in check.
