Introduction

Purpose of the Manual: This manual provides the guidelines for organizing and executing community cleanup events to ensure they are safe, effective, and foster community engagement and environmental stewardship.

Vision Statement: Aligned with Greener Future Youth's mission to protect and preserve the environment through advocacy, education, and action, this initiative aims to engage community members in direct action to clean and beautify our local environments.

1. Planning and Preparation

1.1 Event Coordination

- Selecting the Site:

1.2 Volunteer Engagement
