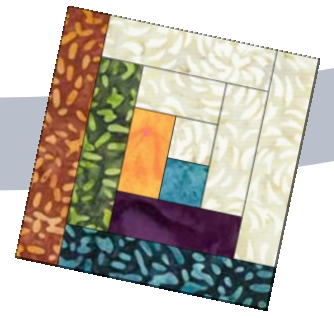
The "Goosus Interruptus" Sampler was created with Banyan Batik Essentials, below you find SKU's for the fabric used.

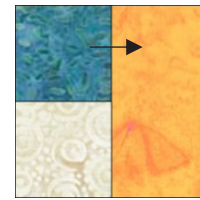

### Piecing Instructions

- Layer (1) Background “A” Square with (1) Assorted “B” square as shown. Sew units together and press towards “B”.

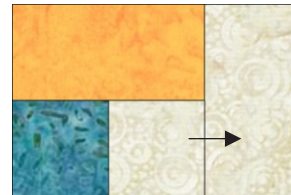


- Turn block **counter-clockwise** and layer (1) Assorted “C” rectangle onto the AB Unit. Sew the Assorted “C” rectangle on and press towards “C”. Block should measure 2-1/2” x 2-1/2”

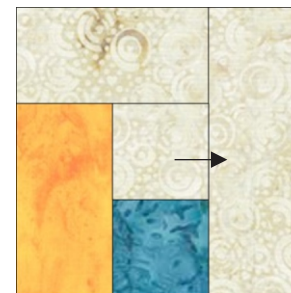


*NOTE: You will turn the block counter clockwise a quarter turn after each seam so the unit you just sewed on is at the top. Then layer the next piece on the right hand side of the block and sew. Make sure to keep the block looking scrappy*

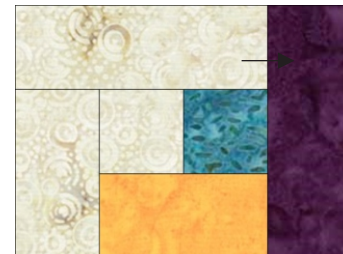
- Turn block and sew on (1) Background “D” rectangle. Press towards “D”



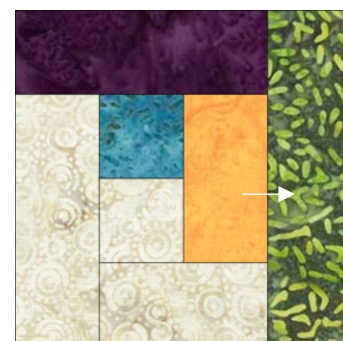
- Turn block and sew on (1) Background “E” rectangle. Press towards “E”. Block should measure 3-1/2” x 3-1/2”



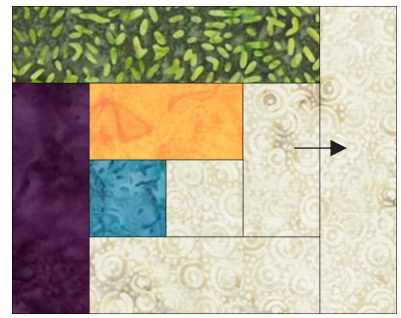
- Turn block and sew on (1) Assorted “F” rectangle. Press towards “F”.



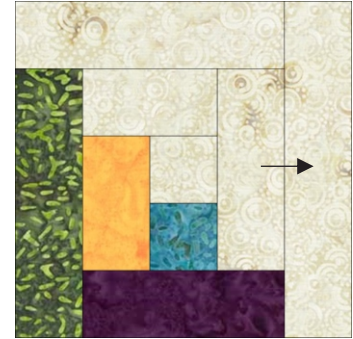
- Turn block and sew on (1) Assorted “G” rectangle . Press towards “G”.  
Block should measure 4-1/2” x 4-1/2”



- Turn block and sew on (1) Background “H” rectangle. Press towards “H”



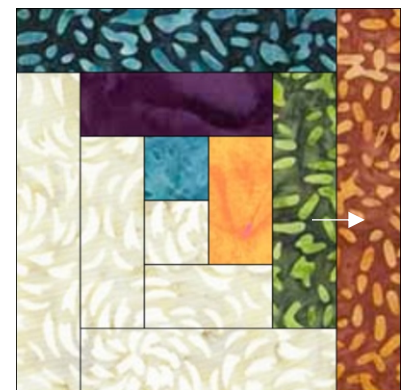
- Turn block and sew on (1) Background “I” rectangle. Press towards “I”. Block should measure 5-1/2” x 5-1/2”



- Turn block and sew on (1) Assorted “J” rectangle. Press towards “J”.

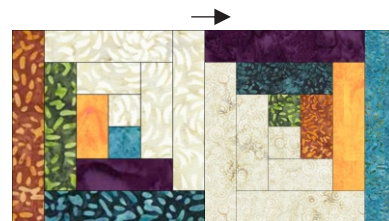


- Turn block and sew on (1) Assorted “K” rectangle . Press towards “K”. Block should measure 6-1/2” x 6-1/2”.



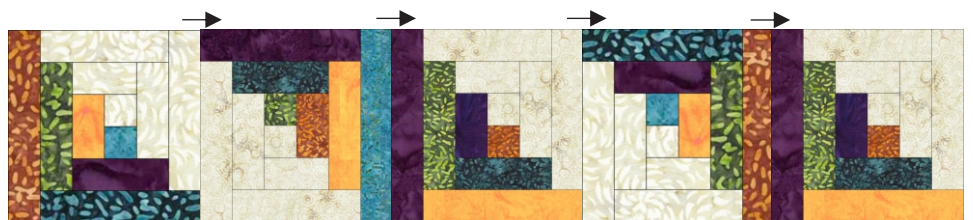
- Repeat **All** previous (8) steps to make a total of (7) Log Cabin Blocks.

- Layout (2) Log Cabin Blocks as shown.



- Sew blocks together, pressing in the direction of the arrow to make (1) Left Log Cabin Unit. Unit should measure 6-1/2” x 12-1/2”

- Layout (5) Log Cabin Blocks as shown.



- Sew blocks together, pressing in the direction of the arrow to make (1) Right Log Cabin Unit. Unit should measure 6-1/2” x 30-1/2”
