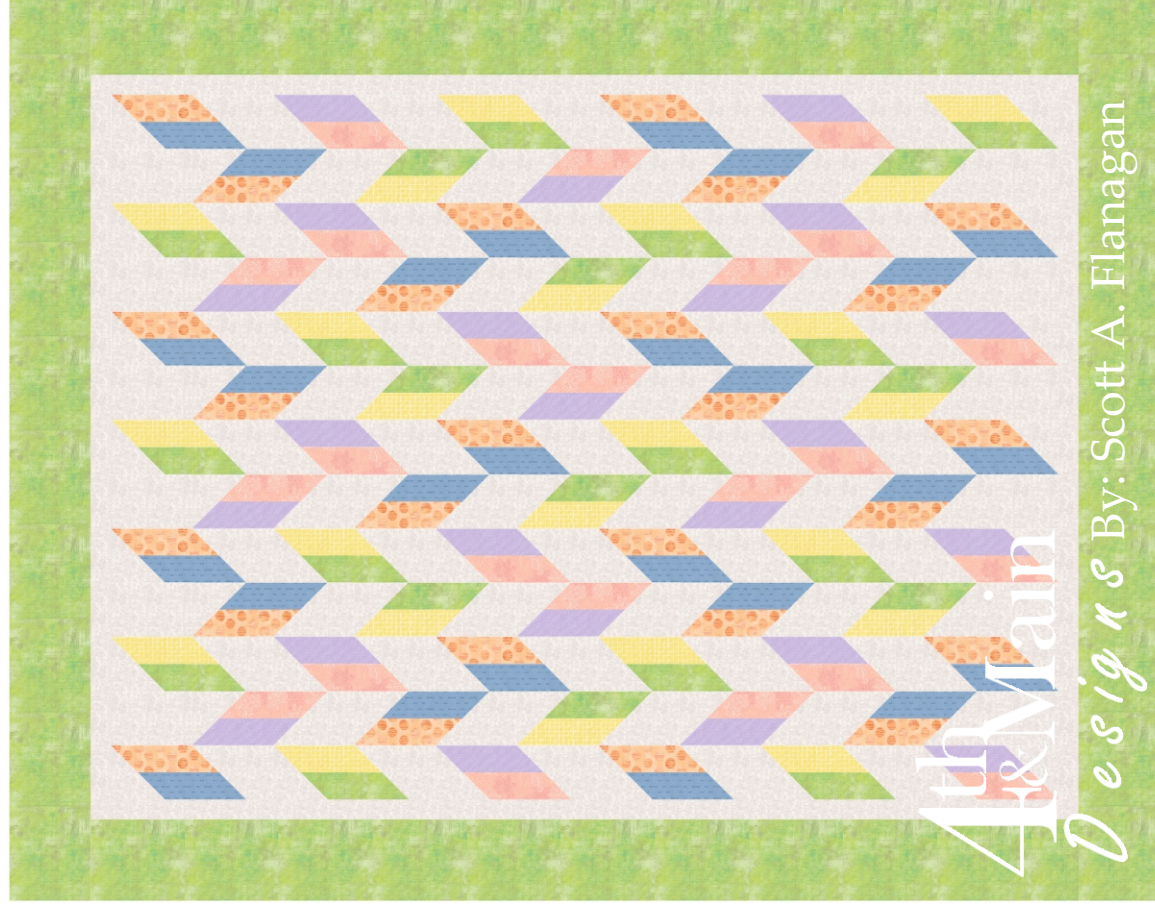

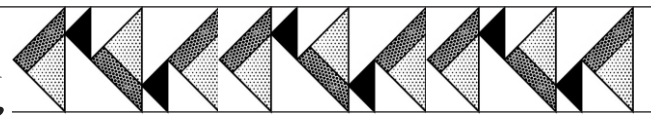
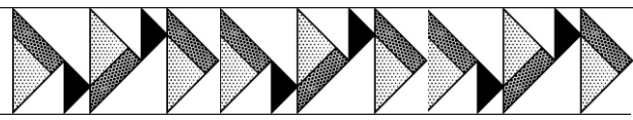
Supplies Needed

- Background 3-1/2 yards
- Assorted 2-1/2” Strips (40)
- Outer Border 2-1/3 yards
- Backing 5-1/4 yards
- Batting 77” x 95”
- Piecing thread

Things to know before you begin

All quantities are cuts are based in 42" wide, 100% cotton fabrics. All measurements include a 1/4" seam allowance.

- WOF - Width of Fabric
- LOF - Length of Fabric
- HST - Half Square Triangle
- QST - Quarter Square Triangle
- FG - Flying geese

Sew with right sides together unless otherwise stated. All directions have been tested and presented in good faith, but no warranty can be given nor results guaranteed.

Cutting Directions

- From Background fabric cut:
(144) 4-1/2" x 4-1/2" (A)
(59) 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" (B)
(12) 4-1/2" x 6-1/2" (C)
(7) 2" x WOF (Inner Border)
- From Assorted 2-1/2" Strips
(144) 2-1/2" x 10-1/2" (D)
- From Border/Binding fabric cut:
(4) 6-1/2" x LOF (Outer Border)
(4) 2-1/2" x LOF (Binding)

Before you begin, thoroughly read through all the instructions.

Piecing Instructions

- Layout (2) Assorted “D” Rectangles as shown.
- Sew rectangles together along the long side pressing in the direction of the arrow to make (1) Strip Set. Strip Set should measure 10-1/2" x 4-1/2"
- Repeat previous (2) steps to make a total of (72) Strip Sets.



- Mark a diagonal line from corner to corner on the backside of (84) Background “A” Squares as shown.



- Layout (2) Background squares on top of (1) Strip Set as shown, paying attention to the direction and position of the drawn line.

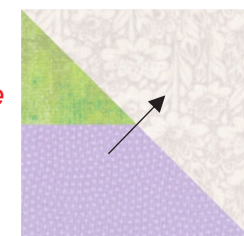


- Sew on the drawn line and trim 1/4” away from the sewn line to make (1) Unit A. Press towards the Background Triangles.



- Repeat previous (3) Steps to make a total of (42) Unit A

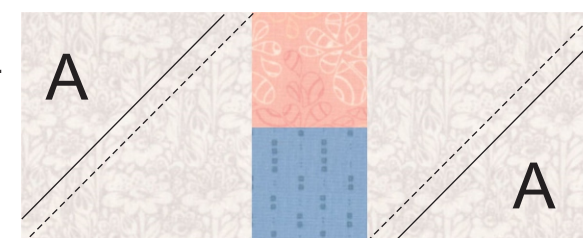
Optional: Sew together the triangles that were cut off to make bonus units to use in another project.



- Mark a diagonal line from corner to corner on the backside of (60) Background “A” Squares as shown.



- Layout (2) Background squares on top of (1) Strip Set as shown, paying attention to the direction and position of the drawn line.

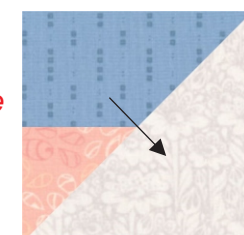


- Sew on the drawn line and trim 1/4” away from the sewn line to make (1) Unit B. Press towards the Background Triangles.

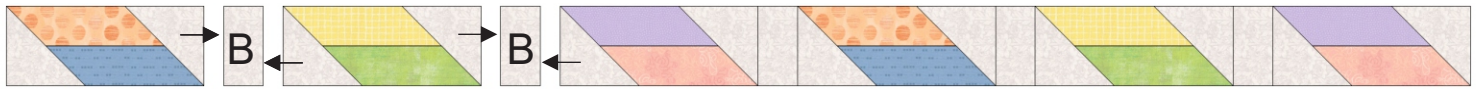


- Repeat previous (3) Steps to make a total of (30) Unit B.

Optional: Sew together the triangles that were cut off to make bonus units to use in another project

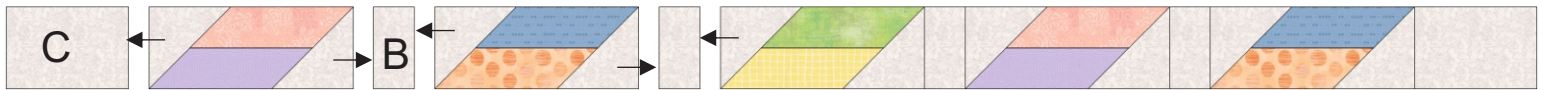


- Layout: (6) Unit A & (5) Background “B” as shown



- Sew units together into a row, pressing in the direction of the arrows. to make (1) “A” Row. Row should measure 4-1/2” x 70-1/2”
- Repeat previous (2) steps to make a total of (7) “A” Rows

- Layout: (5) Unit B (4) Background “B”
(2) Background “C” as shown



- Sew units together into a row, pressing in the direction of the arrows. to make (1) “B” Row. Row should measure 4-1/2” x 70-1/2”
- Repeat previous (2) steps to make a total of (6) “B” Rows

- Layout: (7) “A” Rows & (6) “B” Rows as shown.

- Sew rows together pressing seams in either direction.



- Sew the (7) Inner Border strips together along the short end to make one long strip.
- Measure down the center of your quilt lengthwise and cut (2) border strips to this length
- Sew borders to the left and right sides of the quilt. Press towards the Inner Border
- Measure through the center of your quilt widthwise and cut (2) borders to this length.
- Sew borders to the top and bottom of the quilt. Press towards the Inner Border.



- Measure down the center of your quilt lengthwise and cut (2) border strips to this length
- Sew borders to the left and right sides of the quilt. Press towards the Outer Border
- Measure through the center of your quilt widthwise and cut (2) borders to this length.
- Sew borders to the top and bottom of the quilt. Press towards the Outer Border.
- Quilt, Bind, and Enjoy
