Welcome to the hope of Spring. This has been a cold and snowy winter. More snow than we have seen in a while. Hopefully, everyone was able to get ploughed out. We hope spring will be warm and not too wet with lots of daffodils and trees blooming.

The coming of March brings Purim. Once again, we are invited to join Beth El and Chisuk Emmuna to celebrate together. There will also be a Purim carnival at the Grass Center. Rabbis and their helpers always make it a very enjoyable service.

Passover is a family affair the first seder occurs on a Wednesday night, April 1st. Hopefully families and friends will be together to celebrate. We will not be having a community seder at Beth Shalom, the logistics of such an undertaking are just too complex for our small group to organize.

In April we will have the Reading of the Names. It's just that I the reader, I, the one addressed by the sacred text, am now the very center of the story" We wish you health and happiness as you begin the spring, and hope for good times to come.

I am writing to encourage your attendance at a very important upcoming Jewish community event. Beginning on Monday evening, April 13 at 7:30 pm, Beth El Temple will host our community's annual "Unto Every Person There is a Name" program. This special commemoration seeks to dignify the memories of victims of the Shoah by reading their names aloud. These victims were stripped of their names by their oppressors and tattooed with numbers. Through the public reading of names of Holocaust victims over a twenty-four hour period, this program strives to restore a portion of their humanity and to retrieve them from the lost depths of anonymity.

In an effort to pass the torch of remembrance to the next generation, students from congregational Religious Schools and the Silver Academy will take part in the conduct of the opening ceremony and will also read names immediately following the opening ceremony. We hope that you and your family will be able to attend this special service and stay for a portion of the Reading of Names program.


Please join us at 6:30 pm that same evening at Beth El Temple for a performance of the opera, Brundibar, performed by students from the Silver Academy, Gesher and Temple Ohev Sholom. Brundibár, a children's opera by Czech composer Hans Krása, was performed more than 50 times by Jewish children imprisoned in the Theresienstadt (Terezín) ghetto during the Holocaust. The project explores how art, music, and collective voice can serve as acts of dignity and resistance even in the face of profound injustice. Brundibár's story — in which children band together to overcome oppression — offers a powerful lens for reflecting on resilience, moral courage, and the enduring power of community, ensuring that voices once nearly silenced continue to be heard.





On Lighting the Yahrzeit Candle...

TBS members requested that we include a prayer for lighting the yahrzeit candle in the bulletin. With Rabbi Choper's assistance, the following is provided.

There is no one blessing that is traditionally required to be said when lighting a yahrzeit candle. It is an opportunity to remember our loved ones and how their presence somehow remains with us. The practice of lighting a candle is based at least in part on the verse (Proverbs 20:27) "The Human Soul is the Lamp Of G-d." This is a beautiful teaching that emphasizes the importance of each human being as an opportunity for some aspect of Divine Light to enter into the world, and that somehow each soul is a connection to G-d.

"The Human Soul is the Lamp of G-d." May it be Your will, Adonai our G-d and the G-d of our Ancestors, that the soul of my beloved one should be bound up in the bonds of life, as with the souls of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, Sarah, Rebecca, Rachel and Leah. May (his/her) memory be a blessing to us all."

If desired, it is also traditionally appropriate to recite Psalm 23 or 121.
