## African American History MONTH


WHEREAS, THE THEME FOR THE 1993 AFRICAN-AMERICAN HISTORY MONTH OBSERVANCE IS "AFRO-AMERICAN SCHOLARS, LEADERS, ACTIVISTS, AND WRITERS"; AND  
WHEREAS, THE MONTH OF FEBRUARY, 1993 WILL BE THE 45TH OBSERVANCE OF AFRICAN-AMERICAN HISTORY IN THE CITY OF LOS ANGELES; AND  
WHEREAS, THE OBSERVANCE SERVES TO FOCUS NATIONAL ATTENTION ON THE MANY OUTSTANDING CONTRIBUTIONS AND ACHIEVEMENTS OF AFRICAN-AMERICANS ALL OVER THE WORLD PARTICULARLY IN AMERICA; AND  
WHEREAS, UNDERSTANDING OF THE AFRICAN-AMERICAN IS A KEY TO UNDERSTANDING THE STRENGTH OF OUR NATION; AND  
WHEREAS, PROGRAMS DURING THE MONTH OF FEBRUARY, 1993 WILL EMPHASIZE AFRICAN-AMERICAN ACHIEVEMENTS IN EDUCATION, SCIENCE, ARTS AND OTHER FIELDS OF ENDEAVOR, AND THEY WILL DEMONSTRATE THE GREAT DEPTH OF THE HERITAGE OF BLACK MEN AND WOMEN AND SHOW THE WISDOM OF PURSUING BROTHERHOOD AS A GOAL; AND  
WHEREAS, THE ASSOCIATION FOR THE STUDY OF AFRICAN-AMERICAN LIFE AND HISTORY, INC. HAS SPONSORED THIS AFRICAN-AMERICAN HISTORY RECOGNITION SINCE 1926 TO PROVIDE KNOWLEDGE ABOUT THE CONTRIBUTIONS, INVENTIONS, DISCOVERIES, AND GENERAL PARTICIPATION OF AFRICAN-AMERICANS IN THE LIFE OF THE UNITED STATES; AND  
WHEREAS, AFRICAN-AMERICAN HISTORY MONTH CELEBRATION IS A REDEDICATION TO THE PRINCIPLES OF FREEDOM AND EQUALITY;
